19:15:52 11 Proposed 402. That's 160 spaces short.

19:15:54 12 A. That wasn't my testimony. That may have been on  
19:15:58 13 the record, but it wasn't my testimony.  
19:16:00 14 Q. Was it your attorneys?  
19:16:00 15 A. I think it was the board or my attorney. I  
19:16:04 16 didn't say that, but based upon an analysis by the board  
19:16:10 17 engineer, H2M, Mr. Pessolano indicated a need for 100  
19:16:10 18 spaces.  
19:16:18 19 Q. Is it 100 or 162? What is your position as  
19:16:20 20 the principal --  
19:16:22 21 AUDIENCE MEMBER: We can't hear you.  
19:16:24 22 Q. The question is, is he short 162 spaces or  
19:16:28 23 100 spaces.  
19:16:28 24 THE CHAIRMAN: Counsel, just speak into

19:19:58 21 Q. Another minor issue, that was the major,  
19:20:00 22 another minor issue that you addressed about the use of  
19:20:08 23 your common facilities to the public. What is your  
19:20:10 24 company's proposal to this municipality, specifically,  
19:20:14 25 and also to the different agencies in the City, Little

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19:20:18 1 League, babe Ruth, girl scouts? You mentioned PAL and  
19:20:24 2 other issues. What's your policy currently, and the  
19:20:28 3 policy for this building to permit the use of your  
19:20:30 4 common rooms to the people in the public?  
19:20:36 5 A. With regard to the proposed facility, I mentioned  
19:20:40 6 earlier we'll make our multi-purpose community rooms  
19:20:42 7 available to community groups. It would be done on a  
19:20:46 8 case-by-case basis, depending on the proposed use of the  
19:20:50 9 community group, and the availability of the room.  
19:20:56 10 Q. Availability means, is it a definite that on  
19:21:00 11 so many days a year, non-interior company functions?  
19:21:08 12 A. I don't have any proception as to how many  
19:21:12 13 days or what the ratio is. Again, if the rooms are  
19:21:14 14 available, and there's an appropriate community use, we  
19:21:18 15 will make the room available.  
19:21:18 16 Q. You also testified that at the Prospect  
19:21:22 17 Heights Care Center we open the multi-purpose room for  
19:21:24 18 use of community groups. How many rooms have you  
19:21:34 19 permitted to outside community groups in the Prospect  
19:21:40 20 Heights Center in the year 2009?  
19:21:40 21 A. I don't know a specific number to answer your  
19:21:46 22 question correctly. But I do know as of two weeks ago I  
19:21:48 23 received a request to allow one of the condominium  
19:21:52 24 buildings, I think it was the Devonshire, to meet there  
19:21:58 25 and to have a condominium meeting at our facility at

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19:21:58 1 Prospect Heights.  
19:22:02 2 Q. Do you charge for that?  
19:22:04 3 A. I don't think we charge anything for that.  
19:22:08 4 Certain groups we have a nominal charge if they request  
19:22:12 5 some catering and the like, but we don't typically  
19:22:14 6 charge for the use of the room.  
19:22:16 7 Q. Can you find out for us, at least for the  
19:22:20 8 benefit of my client and I'm sure the people here, and  
19:22:20 9 maybe the Zoning board, find out how many days a year  
19:22:22 10 you permit outside groups to use your facility?  
19:22:26 11 A. Again, what I would like to say it depends,

19:22:30 12 we probably allow -- many times it depends on how many  
19:22:34 13 applicants seek to use the room. Maybe everybody don't  
19:22:38 14 know about it. It is not something we advertise. When  
19:22:42 15 community groups approach us, most reasonable requests  
19:22:42 16 are founded.

19:22:48 17 Q. You testified that the dialysis use will  
19:22:50 18 commence at approximately what time?

19:22:52 19 A. Six o'clock in the morning.

19:22:52 20 Q. What is the municipal ordinance as starting  
19:22:56 21 of a business and medical facilities outside of  
19:22:58 22 hospitals?

19:23:00 23 A. I'm not familiar with that.

19:23:02 24 Q. So how could you propose a commencement time  
19:23:04 25 at six o'clock AM, if you don't know what the ordinance

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19:23:04 1 is?

19:23:08 2 A. This is a hospital, so if you ask for --  
19:23:08 3 with the exception of a hospital, this is a hospital  
19:23:12 4 setting, in a hospital facility.

19:23:14 5 Q. You characterize this as similar to the  
19:23:16 6 Hackensack Medical Center, your facility?

19:23:18 7 A. Absolutely. It's a health care facility,  
19:23:20 8 certainly.

19:23:20 9 Q. Is a doctor's office a health care facility?

19:23:24 10 A. Absolutely.

19:23:24 11 Q. So a doctor's office, under your  
19:23:28 12 interpretation, can open at six o'clock?

19:23:30 13 A. Depends what type of doctor you're going to,  
19:23:32 14 for the most part, yes. I'm not being facetious. A  
19:23:36 15 doctor's office provides health care, that's a common  
19:23:38 16 accepted definition of health care.

19:23:42 17 Q. And so at six o'clock in the morning, you'll  
19:23:44 18 have how many vans that you propose to commence the  
19:23:48 19 transportation of the dialysis patients?

19:23:52 20 A. At full capacity, it would be approximately ten  
19:23:54 21 passenger vans.

19:23:56 22 Q. Per hour.

19:23:56 23 A. No. Ten passenger vans to bring the initial  
19:24:02 24 patients requiring dialysis at 6:00 AM. At or about 6:00  
19:24:02 25 AM.

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19:24:08 1 Q. And how many during the course of the day?

19:24:10 2 A. Approximately 30 all together, bringing patients  
19:24:10 3 for dialysis treatment. There are three treatment times  
19:24:18 4 per day.

19:24:18 5 Q. And with your employees, where do you  
19:24:20 6 propose the employees and visitors to park, in light of  
19:24:20 7 this 162 parking shortfall?

19:24:32 8 MR. BASRALIAN: I object to the frame of  
19:24:34 9 the question. It is a shortfall by virtue of a  
19:24:34 10 determination by the H2H Zoning Consultant of the City  
19:24:42 11 of Hackensack. As I indicated earlier, it is our  
19:24:44 12 position that the 405 spaces provided are adequate. So  
19:24:48 13 if you want to reframe your question -- don't reframe,  
19:24:54 14 determined by the City of Hackensack, rather than what  
19:24:56 15 we believe is appropriate for the facility to the.

19:25:00 16 MR. MALAGIERE: The record is clear, pose  
19:25:02 17 your question. The record is clear you disagree. Pose  
19:25:04 18 the question the way you want, Mr Diktas.

19:25:06 19 Q. Please answer the question. Do you want it read  
19:25:06 20 back.

19:25:06 21 A. Yes.

19:25:06 22 THE COURT REPORTER READ THE QUESTION AS  
19:25:56 23 REQUESTED

19:25:56 24 Q. Were do your employees, your visitors park in  
19:26:00 25 light of this 162 parking shortfall, parking space

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19:26:04 1 shortfall?

19:26:04 2 MR. MALAGIERE: Your objection is noted,  
19:26:08 3 please answer the question.

19:26:08 4 A. We believe that 405 parking spaces we propose to  
19:26:12 5 include in the underground parking garage below the  
19:26:14 6 facility, will adequately meet the needs of all of the  
19:26:18 7 employees and all the visitors for all of the programs  
19:26:20 8 that are proposed.

19:26:22 9 Q. And how many employees do you propose?

19:26:24 10 A. I think I testified earlier that round-the-clock  
19:26:30 11 basis, seven days a week, there will be more than 500  
19:26:36 12 full-time employees.

19:26:38 13 Q. So your testimony is, we have over 500 full-time  
19:26:42 14 employees with 402 parking spaces, and ten vans an hour?

19:26:46 15 A. I don't think you're characterizing that  
19:26:50 16 correctly. I'm trying to make it clear that all 500  
19:26:52 17 employees are not going to be on site at any one time.  
19:26:54 18 It's a 24-hour operation, three shifts, seven days a  
19:26:58 19 week. So those 500 employees would be divided up over

19:27:02 20 all of those shifts, all of those days.  
19:27:04 21 Q. Did you do a study for that?  
19:27:04 22 A. Yes. And our traffic engineer conducted a study  
19:27:08 23 and I believe he will testify at this session or the  
19:27:10 24 next session about that. I can summarize for you one  
19:27:16 25 thing, at no time, based upon all the projections,

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19:27:18 1 staffing, visitors and patients alike, that the arrived  
19:27:22 2 parking spaces exceed what we propose to install at the  
19:27:26 3 facility.  
19:27:28 4 Q. Are you going to take a pro forma study as  
19:27:32 5 to the percentage of beds and facility being used as  
19:27:36 6 your breaking point, 80 percent, 60 percent, with all of  
19:27:40 7 your beds?  
19:27:40 8 A. No.  
19:27:42 9 Q. You've done no financial study to determine  
19:27:44 10 cost analysis and projected costs to your company?  
19:27:48 11 A. Not at this time, no.  
19:27:50 12 Q. Has anyone in your employ, done that outside  
19:27:52 13 of you?  
19:27:54 14 A. No.  
19:27:56 15 MR. DIKTAS: Counsel, as to the parking  
19:27:58 16 issue, I'll reserve that with this parking expert. But  
19:28:00 17 if I may call back this gentleman after we receive  
19:28:04 18 answers?  
19:28:04 19 MR. MALAGIERE: Your reservation is noted  
19:28:10 20 and Mr. Basralian, without objection, your principal  
19:28:12 21 will be available generally throughout the meeting?  
19:28:14 22 MR. BASRALIAN: Yes, he will.  
19:28:16 23 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you, Mr. Basralian.  
19:28:16 24 BY MR. DIKTAS:  
19:28:18 25 Q. You testified, your answer to a question

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19:28:22 1 posed as to the increased traffic in the two years of  
19:28:24 2 construction, and your answer is, was, excuse me, I'm  
19:28:28 3 not going to pretend. There will be some disruption,  
19:28:32 4 but short-lived. Please give us tonight your  
19:28:36 5 interpretation of "some disruption" and what  
19:28:40 6 "short-lived" means?  
19:28:42 7 Let's do first, on a typical day, your  
19:28:48 8 first day of construction, how many trucks will there  
19:28:50 9 be? What's the immobilization so these folks know  
19:28:54 10 what's going on in the neighborhood, and so this Zoning  
19:28:58 11 board will understand.  
19:28:58 12 A. I would like to say, in general, we have not  
19:29:00 13 prepared any detail construction plans for this  
19:29:02 14 facility. I really couldn't address the immobilization  
19:29:06 15 of this construction. What I did say last time, I'll  
19:29:08 16 repeat it again tonight, any construction obviously  
19:29:12 17 involves some disruption involving some construction  
19:29:16 18 vehicles. They take place Monday through Friday, and I  
19:29:20 19 noted that in Hackensack there are prescribed hours in  
19:29:22 20 which construction can take place. I do believe that  
19:29:28 21 construction, and to address your question about the  
19:29:32 22 duration that will be through the personal construction,  
19:29:36 23 that will take up to 24 months. I don't believe the  
19:29:42 24 amount of disruption is excessive, or anything more than  
19:29:46 25 the local roads could handle. The answer is no.

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19:29:54 1 Q. Where do you propose the employees of the  
19:29:56 2 contractor, where are they going to park when the  
19:30:02 3 laborers come in, the excavators and steel workers?  
19:30:04 4 Where do you propose these gentlemen and ladies are  
19:30:08 5 going to park, and in what part of Hackensack, or if you  
19:30:10 6 made alternate plans to transport these folks to this  
19:30:14 7 site, so there is no impact on parking in the  
19:30:18 8 neighborhood?  
19:30:18 9 A. As I mentioned, we do not have any details or  
19:30:22 10 have even outlined a construction schedule of  
19:30:26 11 mobilization. I can't address them at this time.  
19:30:30 12 Q. You have no idea?  
19:30:30 13 A. I'll repeat what I just said.  
19:30:34 14 MR. DIKTAS: I have nothing else.  
19:30:36 15 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you, counsel,  
19:30:38 16 MR. DIKTAS: Thank you, sir.  
19:30:38 17 MR. MALAGIERE: Any other attorneys in  
19:30:38 18 the audience wishing to be heard?  
19:30:38 19 NO RESPONSE

19:30:56 20 MR. MALAGIERE: Mr. Chairman, seeing no  
19:30:56 21 one, Mr. Chairman, do you propose to open this witness  
19:30:58 22 to the public at this time?

19:31:04 23 THE CHAIRMAN: What we did the last  
19:31:06 24 time, I guess, we asked that you would form a line for  
19:31:08 25 the public on one side, anyone wishing to speak.

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19:31:12 1 Why don't we form a line on my left, and  
19:31:20 2 you can ask questions, or if you'd like to speak or  
19:31:24 3 comment about this witness' testimony, please form a  
19:31:26 4 line over to the left.

19:31:26 5 QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS TO THE WITNESS BY MEMBERS  
19:31:26 6 OF THE PUBLIC

19:31:26 7 ALEXIS PALINKAS: Alexis Palinkas, 235  
19:31:26 8 Prospect Avenue, Sworn.

19:32:10 9 QUESTIONS BY MS. PALINKAS: I have a comment and  
19:32:10 10 then questions. Last month when we had the meeting you  
19:32:14 11 were very, very specific saying that this was not a  
19:32:18 12 hospital. There was no maternity ward, no neonatal,  
19:32:22 13 it's not a hospital. Today, you just told us it is in  
19:32:26 14 fact a hospital. When did this change.

19:32:28 15 A. It didn't. What I said last month was that this  
19:32:30 16 is not an acute care hospital such as Hackensack  
19:32:36 17 University Medical Center. It's a hospital. It is  
19:32:36 18 licensed as a hospital and operates as a specialty  
19:32:42 19 hospital according to the New Jersey Department of  
19:32:44 20 Health and Human Service guidelines, and the center for  
19:32:54 21 Medicaid and Medicare Services. By no means it is not a  
19:32:56 22 hospital. It is a hospital.

19:32:56 23 Q. Now, based on my research, we have ample  
19:33:00 24 facilities within even a 20 mile radius to handle all of  
19:33:10 25 these needs that your facility supposedly is bringing to

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19:33:12 1 us, because we need it. I have 39 pages of long-term  
19:33:20 2 care facilities. I believe it is six pages of dialysis  
19:33:28 3 centers. How can you claim there's a need in Hackensack  
19:33:32 4 for this facility? How can you say that?

19:33:36 5 A. Well, first, I would like to say that this is not  
19:33:40 6 what is traditionally known as a long term care  
19:33:44 7 facility. It gets confusing with the name, the way it  
19:33:46 8 is called by the government authorities, a long term  
19:33:50 9 acute care hospital, which is a long term facility  
19:33:54 10 traditionally used as other names for skilled nursing  
19:33:58 11 facilities, are nursing homes. This LTACH or a long term

19:34:02 12 acute care hospital provides a level of health care  
19:34:06 13 services above and beyond of which is provided in a long  
19:34:10 14 term facility. But, yet again, not quite the same level  
19:34:14 15 that is of the health care services that are supplied --  
19:34:18 16 excuse me, not supplied, but provided in an acute care  
19:34:22 17 hospital such as Hackensack Medical Center.  
19:34:26 18 Q. So I could define this and address it at a  
19:34:30 19 time --  
19:34:30 20 A. If you, please.  
19:34:32 21 Q. I certainly will.  
19:34:34 22 MR. MALAGIERE: Until you introduce that  
19:34:36 23 into evidence and present it to the witness and he can  
19:34:40 24 respond to it.  
19:34:42 25 MR. BASRALIAN: I don't have an

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19:34:42 1 objection in presenting it. But it should be presented  
19:34:46 2 at the time of making statements, not presented into  
19:34:48 3 evidence without verification that's part of her proofs,  
19:34:54 4 and this is cross-examination.  
19:34:56 5 MR. MALAGIERE: You could hold onto it.  
19:34:58 6 Let me respond to that. It shouldn't be marked in  
19:35:00 7 evidence, but marked, present it to the witness to use  
19:35:04 8 it to cross-examine, and I'm sure you don't have an  
19:35:06 9 objection to that, you could cross-examine with that  
19:35:14 10 caveat. Do you wish to use what you have to  
19:35:16 11 cross-examine this witness at this time?  
19:35:18 12 MS. PALINKAS: No, not now.  
19:35:18 13 Q. Two other comments. The park on Summit  
19:35:22 14 Avenue is in essence truly a grassy covered roof, a  
19:35:26 15 parking garage. That's a statement. And I also would  
19:35:30 16 like to disagree with your numbers. The last time you  
19:35:34 17 spoke, you told us that and you admitted that for  
19:35:38 18 Prospect Heights, it was a major mistake. I shouldn't  
19:35:42 19 say major, it was a mistake in the parking facilities,  
19:35:44 20 that you were not adequately prepared for that.  
19:35:48 21 How can we trust you that this time you're  
19:35:52 22 not going to make another mistake?  
19:35:54 23 A. I don't think I testified it was a mistake, but  
19:35:56 24 what I can tell you is that the parking that was  
19:36:00 25 provided at Prospect Heights Care Center when it was

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19:36:06 1 built, even according to today's zoning ordinance, the  
19:36:10 2 number of parking spaces not just meets, exceeds by far  
19:36:14 3 the required number of spaces.

19:36:16 4 Q. Have you tried to park there?

19:36:16 5 A. Yes, I have.

19:36:18 6 Q. Well, so have I, and you cannot park there.

19:36:20 7 Thank you.

19:36:20 8 HOWARD HURWITZ: Howard Hurwitz, 326

19:36:20 9 Prospect Avenue, Sworn. QUESTIONS BY HOWARD HURWITZ:

19:36:48 10 Q. I just want to clear up some of your

19:36:50 11 previous testimony. In response to, I guess, some of

19:36:54 12 the questions asked at the last hearing, I think you and

19:36:58 13 one of the audience members pondered back and forth how

19:37:04 14 many dialysis trips there would be. I think looking at

19:37:08 15 the number of long term care and the numbers of adult

19:37:14 16 daycare people, you came to the conclusion that

19:37:16 17 somewhere around 70 to 75 outside clients would come in

19:37:24 18 each shift for dialysis of the 84 beds.

19:37:32 19 A. I don't recall the number being quite so

19:37:34 20 high.

19:37:36 21 Q. Let me give you my analysis. You said there

19:37:38 22 are 144 beds. You figured about one-third would require

19:37:42 23 dialysis three times a week, which would basically mean

19:37:50 24 24 of these people per day, you got to figure of the 250

19:37:58 25 coming in to the adult daycare, maybe ten percent. So I

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19:38:00 1 calculated there would be 84 beds, 12 of these people

19:38:08 2 per shift would be coming from the interior, and the

19:38:12 3 rest from the outside. Let's say I'm wrong, it is only

19:38:18 4 65. But there's a large number of people coming from

19:38:20 5 the outside. You testified they would arrive by van,

19:38:24 6 and in answer to some questions you indicated the van

19:38:28 7 might carry five, six or ten patients. Is that really a

19:38:36 8 reasonable number? Let me ask you a question, where do

19:38:40 9 the vans come from bringing the dialysis people?

19:38:42 10 A. The vans would be either operated by another

19:38:48 11 facility or an outside transportation company.

19:38:52 12 Q. Let me ask you, in Prospect Heights when you

19:38:56 13 send patients out for dialysis, and I'm sure you do, how

19:38:58 14 is that done?

19:39:00 15 A. Is it done through a combination of Prospect

19:39:02 16 Heights who has its own van which seats I believe

19:39:04 17 thirteen passengers. So that's used for some of the

19:39:08 18 patients for dialysis, and outside sublet companies are

19:39:14 19 used to transport dialysis patients.



19:39:14 20 Q. What percentage of people are ambulatory  
19:39:14 21 that don't require a wheelchair or some other help?  
19:39:26 22 A. I don't believe I could give you that  
19:39:26 23 specific number. But, I'll venture to guess that  
19:39:32 24 roughly 50 percent are ambulatory and the remainder is  
19:39:36 25 not.

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19:39:36 1 Q. The reason this is important later there  
19:39:40 2 will be testimony about bringing these vans into the  
19:39:42 3 building, unloading these vans, getting the patients out  
19:39:46 4 of the vans, up to the 19th floor, getting them seated  
19:39:52 5 and then bringing them back down. And it is important  
19:39:54 6 that we understand how long it is going to take for a  
19:39:58 7 patient to get from the van into the elevator upstairs,  
19:40:02 8 while the van is waiting, and how long you have to park  
19:40:08 9 the van downstairs for the patients to come back? I  
19:40:12 10 think we're going to need testimony about this. When  
19:40:14 11 we're talking about, as I said in the mid morning,  
19:40:20 12 approximately 70 people are going to be leaving and 70  
19:40:22 13 new people will be coming in and I really don't think  
19:40:26 14 most of these people will be coming in ten to a van. I  
19:40:32 15 would like to hear that testimony that there will be ten  
19:40:40 16 to a van.  
19:40:40 17 A. Huh-hum.  
19:40:42 18 Q. I would like to ask you another question  
19:40:44 19 about the daycare center, you call it, and I guess an  
19:40:48 20 adult medical daycare center.  
19:40:50 21 A. Yes.  
19:40:52 22 Q. But then in all of your testimony you referred to  
19:40:56 23 the fact that this was limited to seniors on Medicare or  
19:41:02 24 medicaid. Is this correct?  
19:41:02 25 A. No?

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19:41:04 1 Q. That's what you said, you constantly --  
19:41:08 2 A. Let me clarify that for you.  
19:41:10 3 Q. Let's find out what it is.  
19:41:12 4 A. Medicaid happens to be an important resource for  
19:41:16 5 many people. The visitors that frequent and need an  
19:41:16 6 adult daycare, the majority of course in New Jersey, I  
19:41:24 7 don't know the exact statistics, but I guess two-thirds  
19:41:28 8 to maybe 90 percent of the people that enter into an  
19:41:34 9 adult daycare center, it could be paid for by Medicaid.  
19:41:38 10 People can come on a private basis or if they happen to  
19:41:42 11 have insurance that covers adult daycare, they could

19:41:46 12 come under that.  
19:41:48 13 Q. This is not limited to over 65, or is it?  
19:41:50 14 A. Most adult daycare or adult medical daycare  
19:41:56 15 centers cater to people who are 65 and older. However,  
19:42:00 16 I'll add that there are people in the community disabled  
19:42:06 17 that need help with various things and can benefit with  
19:42:08 18 the services, by no means are restricted, but in  
19:42:12 19 practice, the majority of people are over 65.  
19:42:16 20 Q. But this is not -- you're asking for  
19:42:20 21 permission to carry out a business here, and I want to  
19:42:24 22 find out if it's restricted to seniors.  
19:42:26 23 You testified there is a need for 800 some odd  
19:42:30 24 slots, 870 some odd slots and we didn't have enough. Is  
19:42:30 25 that correct?

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19:42:38 1 A. No, that's not what I said. What I did say  
19:42:40 2 today there are roughly 840 adult medical daycare slots  
19:42:46 3 in Bergen County. But I believe, and I think the  
19:42:50 4 statistics and demographics that are out show a much  
19:42:52 5 greater need today and in the coming years, as the  
19:42:54 6 population ages, there will be a significantly greater  
19:42:58 7 need for adult medical daycare.  
19:43:02 8 Q. Let me ask you a question. I know most of  
19:43:04 9 the local adult daycare centers in Paramus, Fairlawn and  
19:43:12 10 the surrounding towns operate on a two shift basis.  
19:43:14 11 They bring people either in the morning until one and  
19:43:18 12 then from one to five. Is that your intention?  
19:43:20 13 A. We would have multiple shifts. It all  
19:43:26 14 depends on the participant's needs. Some seniors might  
19:43:28 15 come for all day, eight to five. Some might come in the  
19:43:32 16 morning hours. Some night leave in the afternoon hours.  
19:43:36 17 It all depends on the people's needs.  
19:43:38 18 Q. So a slot, therefore if it's 250 slots,  
19:43:42 19 you're really talking about a potential 350 to 400  
19:43:46 20 clients?  
19:43:48 21 A. The capacity of 250 is the most that could be  
19:43:52 22 present at one time at the facility. The overall  
19:43:56 23 participants who would visit the center, and we intend  
19:44:04 24 to be open six days a week, would be greater than 250.  
19:44:10 25 Q. You stated 25 to 35 vans coming in the

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19:44:12 1 morning, bringing the people in. And then during the  
19:44:16 2 day, presumably, some would leave. Some would come back.  
19:44:20 3 And then in the evening, they would be leaving.

19:44:22 4 Are you going to offer during the day, day trips  
19:44:28 5 too? Many of these adult daycare centers take trips to  
19:44:34 6 libraries or shopping. Would you be running vans in and  
19:44:36 7 out during the day for that service?

19:44:38 8 A. There would be a limited number of  
19:44:42 9 extracurricular trips. Not any significant large number,  
19:44:44 10 no.

19:44:46 11 Q. Are you aware there's an application before  
19:44:46 12 this board in Hackensack for 200 adult daycare center  
19:44:54 13 slots, which would presumably serve 300 people in an  
19:44:58 14 existing building?

19:45:00 15 A. I'm not thoroughly familiar with it but --

19:45:02 16 Q. I'm just pointing out that your need may not  
19:45:10 17 really be there because we're talking 200 new slots, it  
19:45:12 18 would be 300 people or 400 people and --

19:45:16 19 A. I think what I did identify at last month's  
19:45:18 20 meeting was projections for the year 2013. That's less  
19:45:26 21 than five years from now, 150 thousand people in Bergen  
19:45:32 22 County, 65 years of age and older, and as we sit here  
19:45:34 23 today, as I stand here, within three miles of the  
19:45:40 24 proposed site there are more than 38,000 seniors over  
19:45:44 25 the age of 65. And again there is no current adult

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19:45:44 1 daycare in Hackensack.

19:45:54 2 Q. Yes, I know. But you have Paramus and quite  
19:45:54 3 a number --

19:45:56 4 A. There are other towns and other centers,  
19:45:56 5 yes.

19:46:02 6 Q. And they do serve Hackensack. I guess I have  
19:46:02 7 one more question and that is, just in general, the  
19:46:08 8 business of LTACH we heard in recent years, numbers of  
19:46:14 9 hospitals going bankrupt and they close. In fact,  
19:46:18 10 Pascack Valley is now closed and subject of some dispute  
19:46:24 11 between some various hospitals.

19:46:26 12 Is there any reason why a vacant hospital like  
19:46:32 13 that couldn't serve very well as an LTACH? I'm not  
19:46:42 14 asking you to move your facility, is there any --

19:46:46 15 A. I would say that would be a possibility.

19:46:50 16 MR. HURWITZ: Okay. Thank you.

19:46:58 17 THE CHAIRMAN: At this time, at this  
19:47:00 18 point, there is an understanding that there are people  
19:47:02 19 out in the hallway. What we would like to do is try to

19:47:08 20 get everyone in here.  
19:47:10 21 MR. MELLONE: If we could come in and  
19:47:14 22 fill in the aisles. If you'd all move in, and also I  
19:47:16 23 ask if there are any open seats in the middle, just fill  
19:47:22 24 those vacant seats that are in the audience. We would  
19:47:24 25 appreciate that.

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19:47:24 1 JOHN McKINNAY: John McKinnay, 280  
19:47:24 2 Prospect Avenue, sworn. It is really John, but I call  
19:47:24 3 myself Jack. QUESTIONS BY MR. Mc KINNAY:  
19:49:26 4 Q. I was at the White Hall for 22 years,  
19:49:30 5 probably one of the older members there. I came to the  
19:49:34 6 White Hall 22 years ago because I thought it was a  
19:49:38 7 beautiful building on a beautiful street. And I have  
19:49:42 8 never regretted it. When I hear about this building  
19:49:50 9 coming, I have great doubts about what we can do for the  
19:49:56 10 future on one street and on the street of others. On  
19:50:04 11 Summit, I really just have two questions to ask. The  
19:50:18 12 initial view of walking along Summit Avenue at about two  
19:50:20 13 or three o'clock in the afternoon, any day of the week,  
19:50:28 14 if you walk along Summit Avenue at two or three o'clock  
19:50:34 15 in the afternoon between Passaic Street and Central  
19:50:40 16 Avenue, the cars are backed up from light to light.  
19:50:54 17 That's not one day a week, that's five days a week. It  
19:50:58 18 could be Saturday as well. The only day that it is not  
19:51:02 19 there, is Sunday. And I don't believe you're open on  
19:51:04 20 Sunday. What you're trying to do, I believe, is destroy  
19:51:18 21 our neighborhood.  
19:51:26 22 The second question I had related to --  
19:51:38 23 MR.MALAGIERE: Because you responded so  
19:51:38 24 well with that one.  
19:51:40 25 Q. The second question I had relates to the

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19:51:42 1 building itself. Initially I thought the front of your  
19:51:48 2 new hospital would be facing prospect. Now, I believe it  
19:51:54 3 is facing Summit. Is that correct?  
19:51:58 4 A. Technically, the front entrance is on grade on  
19:52:04 5 the south side of the building, not facing either Summit  
19:52:06 6 or Prospect, but it's closer to the Prospect Avenue  
19:52:10 7 side.  
19:52:10 8 Q. Well, I'll put it this way. It is certainly from  
19:52:12 9 what I see from the pictures, it is certainly not facing  
19:52:16 10 Prospect, is it?  
19:52:18 11 A. What I would tell you that the building, the

19:52:22 12 proposed building, has four sides. And there's no rear  
19:52:24 13 end to it.  
19:52:26 14 Q. I'm glad you said that because what you have from  
19:52:30 15 the pictures and what we see, what you have is a back  
19:52:38 16 wall, as it were facing Summit -- facing Prospect, the  
19:52:44 17 back wall without a window in it, as I understand,  
19:52:48 18 without windows in it. Can you think of anything more  
19:52:52 19 ugly?  
19:52:56 20 A. I'll tell you, I believe that the building that  
19:53:00 21 the architect designed, I believe who will be our next  
19:53:04 22 witness, it's an incredibly beautiful piece of  
19:53:06 23 architecture.  
19:53:06 24 Q. And I would ask your patients and the  
19:53:12 25 audience, would anyone here like to live in a building

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19:53:14 1 without windows?  
19:53:16 2 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: No, no.  
19:53:18 3 MR. MALAGIERE: Sir, sir. I appreciate  
19:53:20 4 your commitment to this, you have to keep asking  
19:53:22 5 questions.  
19:53:24 6 Q. Would you like to live in a house without a back  
19:53:26 7 window?  
19:53:28 8 A. I'll tell you that there is an amazing amount  
19:53:34 9 of glazing in this building. All of the patients have a  
19:53:36 10 live view, all of the patients and staff members in the  
19:53:38 11 building. It is much more than most buildings, including  
19:53:44 12 the buildings on Prospect or Summit.  
19:53:46 13 Q. Am I correct then, the picture I have seen, shows  
19:53:46 14 no window.  
19:53:50 15 MR. BASRALIAN: That back wall has a  
19:53:50 16 window.  
19:53:52 17 THE WITNESS: Again, I would ask you to  
19:53:54 18 wait and see the full blown --  
19:53:56 19 Q. Can't you answer?  
19:53:58 20 A. I don't know the number of windows. I hesitate --  
19:54:04 21 Q. The picture shows no window. How ugly do  
19:54:08 22 you want to make it?  
19:54:10 23 A. I guess beauty is in the eye of the beholder.  
19:54:10 24 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: (Sounds)  
19:54:16 25 Q. And absurdity is in the mind of the creator.

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19:54:32 1 I'll ask every one here, all of you gentlemen, can you  
19:54:36 2 imagine living in a home on a street where you have to  
19:54:42 3 face a building without a window, walking back and  
19:54:50 4 forth? The only question I have, the only question I  
19:54:54 5 have is how ugly can it get? Thank you.

19:54:58 6 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you.

19:55:02 7 MR. BASRALIAN: Just so I don't pop up  
19:55:04 8 after every witness's statement, I have the same  
19:55:08 9 objection. I recognize there's a lot of latitude to the  
19:55:12 10 people not being represented by attorneys, and in  
19:55:14 11 answering questions and sometimes making statements when  
19:55:18 12 it's cross-examination, I would ask that the questions  
19:55:18 13 be directed to the witness rather than statements  
19:55:20 14 because there would be adequate time, at the conclusion,  
19:55:24 15 for everyone to make a statement. And I would ask the  
19:55:26 16 board to direct the people to ask questions.

17 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you. Give us your  
18 name, please.

19 MOREY RUNIN: Morey Runin, 280 Prospect  
20 Avenue, Sworn. QUESTIONS BY MR. RUNIN:

21 Q. First off, on the record, I'm adamantly  
19:56:02 22 opposed to the project. My question for you, what  
19:56:02 23 provisions are being planned to ensure proper disposal  
19:56:06 24 of all the medical waste, which is scheduled to be  
19:56:12 25 created?

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19:56:12 1 A. We don't have a detailed plan, but I could tell  
19:56:16 2 you --

19:56:16 3 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: (Sounds).

19:56:18 4 A. -- all I can tell you that there are State  
19:56:22 5 guidelines on the storage and removal of medical waste  
19:56:26 6 and those will be followed to the "T".

19:56:28 7 Q. Do you have any idea how it is going to  
19:56:32 8 impact our water system, sewer system in City of  
19:56:34 9 Hackensack?

19:56:36 10 A. Yes, I do. It would not affect the sewer  
19:56:38 11 system in Hackensack at all. They would be disposed of  
19:56:40 12 off site.

19:56:42 13 Q. I have another question. How can you go  
19:56:44 14 into a project of this magnitude without having any idea  
19:56:48 15 as to what your overall cost is going to be? Unless you  
19:56:54 16 have an unlimited source of funds and don't worry  
19:56:56 17 whether it is one million, ten million or 100 million or  
19:57:00 18 what?

19:57:02 19 A. I'm generally familiar with what guidelines

19:57:04 20 are of construction of facilities of this type, as well  
19:57:08 21 as our design consultants.  
19:57:10 22 Q. So you do have an approximate cost?  
19:57:12 23 A. I know what the ballpark is, and the range  
19:57:14 24 for what it takes.  
19:57:16 25 Q. Can you tell us what you think the ballpark

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19:57:18 1 figure is?  
19:57:18 2 A. I'm not prepared tonight to give you those  
19:57:20 3 figures.  
19:57:22 4 Q. You just said you know what it is?  
19:57:22 5 A. What I said is, that I know what the  
19:57:26 6 ballpark on a per square foot basis is. But I don't  
19:57:30 7 have anywhere near a concrete or detailed estimate of  
19:57:34 8 what this particular building would cost.  
19:57:36 9 Q. Well, I still say how can you go into this  
19:57:38 10 without --  
19:57:40 11 A. The way I do it, I've been in this business,  
19:57:42 12 the health care business for more than 25 years. I built  
19:57:44 13 a number of facilities and sometimes as a businessman I  
19:57:48 14 go by the seat of my pants, and I'm comfortable in being  
19:57:48 15 here in --  
19:57:54 16 Q. -- at this point I want to say lots of luck.  
19:58:06 17 MR. MALAGIERE: Sir, can you give us an  
19:58:06 18 approximate cost per square foot?  
19:58:08 19 THE WITNESS: Anywhere between 200 and  
19:58:10 20 400 dollars per square foot.  
19:58:14 21 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you.  
19:58:14 22 WILLIAM SHRODER: William Shroder, 245  
19:58:14 23 PROSPECT, Apt 19A, Sworn. QUESTIONS BY MR. SHRODER:  
19:58:14 24 Q. My name is William Shroder, 245 Prospect  
19:58:36 25 19-A. I just want to embellish a little bit about the

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19:58:42 1 location of your commercial facility. I believe three  
19:58:46 2 lots on Summit Avenue, is that correct?  
19:58:50 3 A. It is a total of four lots. Three on Summit  
19:58:52 4 and one on Prospect, yes.  
19:58:54 5 Q. Part of your commercial building, three  
19:58:56 6 quarters of it or so, will be on Summit Avenue.  
19:59:00 7 A. That's not correct. The proposal is to site  
19:59:02 8 the facility strictly on the Prospect side of the  
19:59:06 9 property. No building on the Summit side of the  
19:59:06 10 property.  
19:59:16 11 Q. Part of the venture will be on Summit

19:59:18 12 Avenue, three lots on Summit.  
19:59:20 13 A. I think what I can do is just try to summarize  
19:59:22 14 that, but I think you'll see from a later witness we're  
19:59:26 15 proposing to put an underground parking structure under  
19:59:30 16 the entire property, which includes Summit Avenue. But  
19:59:34 17 on the Summit Avenue side of the property, we're  
19:59:36 18 proposing to install a park that will be open to the  
19:59:40 19 public.  
19:59:40 20 Q. I think we can all agree that Summit Avenue is  
19:59:44 21 probably the finest residential street in town. We all  
19:59:50 22 agree on that?  
19:59:54 23 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: Yes.  
19:59:54 24 Q. It's the crown jewel of Hackensack. I don't know  
19:59:58 25 if anyone on the board has a home on Summit, do you live

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20:00:00 1 on Summit Avenue?  
20:00:02 2 A. No, I do not.  
20:00:04 3 Q. I don't. I can't afford to live on Summit Avenue.  
20:00:08 4 However, if this is passed, maybe you could afford to buy  
20:00:14 5 three or four homes on Summit Avenue. I question the  
20:00:16 6 location with regards to a commercial building on Summit  
20:00:20 7 Avenue. As far as I know, there are none as of now. Is  
20:00:24 8 that correct? Have you considered at all 6th Street,  
20:00:34 9 River Road, Main Street, Route 17, Route 4? How about in  
20:00:38 10 and around the Courthouse on Hudson Avenue, whatever that  
20:00:42 11 is. I think to begin this on Summit Avenue will just get  
20:00:50 12 the ball rolling and God knows --  
20:00:50 13 AUDIENCE CLAPPING  
20:01:00 14 Q. -- in a few years time, high rise-to-high  
20:01:04 15 rise on both sides of the street on Summit Avenue, from  
20:01:08 16 Springfield Avenue to Essex Street. Does anyone want to  
20:01:12 17 see that, do you want to see that?  
20:01:14 18 A. We're not proposing that.  
20:01:18 19 Q. Do you live next to a hospital yourself?  
20:01:20 20 A. No, I do not.  
20:01:24 21 Q. So you have seized an opportunity, a profit  
20:01:28 22 making opportunity, to build a commercial venture on  
20:01:34 23 Summit Avenue, the Crown jewel of residential in  
20:01:36 24 Hackensack. Is what you've done, as far as I can see,  
20:01:40 25 and I don't think you've done it out of a sense of



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20:01:46 1 altruism, all you see is a profit making venture and you  
20:01:52 2 jumped all over it. And if it goes through, the people  
20:01:54 3 will be selling out on Summit people. If this goes  
20:01:58 4 through, the dominos will begin to fall. I understand it  
20:02:06 5 has a redeeming social value, your facility, is that  
20:02:06 6 correct?

20:02:10 7 A. We believe we're providing services, health  
20:02:12 8 care services to the community that need them, yes.

20:02:20 9 Q. If it's a redeeming social value you offer,  
20:02:22 10 how about a nice little amusement park there on Summit  
20:02:26 11 Avenue? How about a prison facility? That has a  
20:02:34 12 redeeming social value. A movie complex? How about a  
20:02:38 13 nice night club? You're in it for one thing, a big  
20:02:48 14 profit. You seized an opportunity, it is going to ruin  
20:02:50 15 Summit Avenue, and I don't believe any of you folks live  
20:02:52 16 there, I hope you don't, it is not looking good for the  
20:02:56 17 future.

20:02:58 18 MR. MALAGIERE: Do you have anything  
20:03:00 19 further, sir?

20:03:00 20 MR. SHRODER: I have a lot, but I took up  
20:03:02 21 enough time.

20:03:02 22 MR. MALAGIERE: I appreciate it. Thank  
20:03:02 23 you very much.

20:03:12 24 MR. BASRALIAN: As a curtesy to Mr.  
20:03:14 25 Schroder, I did not interrupt. I want to reiterate, it is

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20:03:18 1 not a place for statement grandstanding. It is for  
20:03:18 2 questions of the witness.

20:03:18 3 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: SOUNDS.

20:03:24 4 THE CHAIRMAN: Stop.

20:03:24 5 MR. BASRALIAN: I don't like to get up  
20:03:28 6 and object when someone is doing this. On the other  
20:03:30 7 hand, this is to ask questions of this witness based  
20:03:32 8 upon what he said at the last hearing. And I would ask  
20:03:36 9 the board to direct them to keep the questions to that  
20:03:38 10 testimony, and not make statements. There will be plenty  
20:03:40 11 of time for it.

20:03:42 12 THE CHAIRMAN: Acknowledged.

20:03:46 13 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you, Mr. Basralian.  
20:03:46 14 Sir?

20:04:00 15 TED MOSKOWITZ 307 Prospect, Sworn. Where  
20:04:00 16 my wife and I have lived for the past 24 years, 307  
20:04:04 17 Prospect Avenue, apartment 16-G QUESTIONS BY MR.  
20:04:04 18 MOSKOWITZ

20:04:26 19 Q. Mr. Pineles, when you built Prospect

20:04:30 20 Heights, who was your architect? Who was your  
20:04:30 21 architect?

20:04:30 22 A. It was Brickhard, Richman Szbarbay &  
20:04:30 23 Associates.

20:04:34 24 Q. Who did your site plan?

20:04:38 25 A. I can't recall, to tell you the truth.

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20:04:40 1 Q. Do you recall who did your parking study?

20:04:42 2 A. No.

20:04:46 3 Q. Was it Boswell?

20:04:48 4 A. I don't believe so.

20:04:48 5 Q. Do you know who it was?

20:04:50 6 A. I don't know.

20:04:50 7 Q. I thought I would just help you out for one  
20:04:54 8 minute. Your testimony was almost characterized properly  
20:04:58 9 what you said in relation to the questions concerning  
20:05:02 10 Prospect Heights was "to a certain extent, that's true,  
20:05:06 11 yes. Let me explain that we recognize and we identified  
20:05:08 12 earlier parking is an issue at the Prospect Heights  
20:05:12 13 Center." And then you went on to annunciate a little  
20:05:20 14 further about it. Do you expect the same kind of surprise  
20:05:24 15 here?

20:05:24 16 A. I went onto to say at the last month's  
20:05:26 17 hearing, we recognize there could be much more parking at  
20:05:32 18 Prospect Heights Care Center. I stated earlier today that  
20:05:36 19 the parking, the number of parking spots that were  
20:05:40 20 provided at the time Prospect Heights Care Center was  
20:05:44 21 built, met and exceeded by far the parking requirements  
20:05:48 22 of the ordinance, and they exceed that requirement of  
20:05:52 23 today's ordinance. But taking the experience that we had  
20:05:56 24 with Prospect Heights, we took that into account and made  
20:06:00 25 extra efforts to provide what we believe is more than

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20:06:04 1 adequate parking for the needs of Bergen Passaic LTACH.

20:06:08 2 Q. Actually I don't think that's what you said  
20:06:10 3 last time. What you said, you ratified the fact that you  
20:06:12 4 don't allow your employees to park in the parking lot at  
20:06:16 5 Prospect Heights. That's what you said, but enough of  
20:06:20 6 Prospect Heights.

20:06:20 7 You're confident in the parking study, and the  
20:06:26 8 traffic study that you put before this board, you're  
20:06:28 9 confident?

20:06:28 10 A. Yes.

20:06:30 11 Q. Is Boswell still employed by you?

20:06:32 12 A. No.  
20:06:32 13 Q. So the people who did your traffic study and  
20:06:34 14 your parking study, who were going to testify by your  
20:06:40 15 experts here, are no longer employed by you?  
20:06:42 16 A. There was a change of engineers requested by the  
20:06:50 17 City and the information and the design prepared by  
20:06:52 18 Boswell was handed off to a new engineering outfit.  
20:06:58 19 Q. Handed off, changed the figures to fix them. In  
20:07:00 20 other words, I asked you if Boswell was representing  
20:07:02 21 you, the answer to that isn't why they aren't, the  
20:07:06 22 answer to that is a yes or no, just as Mr. Basralian has  
20:07:10 23 asked for proper questions, I think I should ask for a  
20:07:14 24 proper answer.  
20:07:14 25 AUDIENCE MEMBERS SOUNDS.

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20:07:18 1 Q. The answer is no, isn't it?  
20:07:20 2 A. I'm trying to be as responsive as possible to  
20:07:22 3 your questions. I don't think your question would be  
20:07:26 4 well served by a yes or no answer.  
20:07:28 5 Q. All right. So that's kind of like you don't  
20:07:30 6 know how much it costs yet, right? When you were here a  
20:07:38 7 month ago, you spoke about how ideal this site was  
20:07:42 8 because of the demographics. Some of your materials  
20:07:46 9 have spoken to the fact that Bergen County is the most  
20:07:50 10 highly populated county in the State. Did they not?  
20:07:52 11 A. That's correct.  
20:07:56 12 Q. They don't have the highest population  
20:07:58 13 density, do they?  
20:08:00 14 A. I believe they do, or at least the density of  
20:08:04 15 population in Bergen County is more than three times the  
20:08:06 16 average of the State of New Jersey. It is roughly 3,600  
20:08:10 17 people per square --  
20:08:12 18 Q. You're not looking to build one of those  
20:08:14 19 centers in Warren or Huntington County, are you? Or out  
20:08:18 20 in the horse country?  
20:08:20 21 A. I don't think that's where I am tonight, no.  
20:08:24 22 Q. So Bergen is far from the most density  
20:08:28 23 county. Aren't there at least three counties that are  
20:08:30 24 more densely populated?  
20:08:34 25 A. I don't know what the figures for those three

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20:08:36 1 counties are.

20:08:38 2 Q. What you represented to us and the Board  
20:08:40 3 here at the last meeting, is that the population of  
20:08:44 4 Bergen County is the highest of the State, and has three  
20:08:50 5 times the density of any other county in the State --

20:08:54 6 A. The average population --

20:08:56 7 Q. But the average in terms of building a new  
20:08:58 8 facility is kind of meaningless. There is not really  
20:09:00 9 any chance someone is going to put the Garden State  
20:09:04 10 Plaza in the middle of Pinelands.

20:09:06 11 A. I don't know what some developer might have in  
20:09:10 12 mind.

20:09:10 13 Q. Whether you're funning with me, I need to  
20:09:12 14 fun with you a little bit. I'm trying not to be  
20:09:14 15 argumentative, sir. You certainly don't think Hackensack  
20:09:20 16 is one of the largest cities in the State, do you?

20:09:22 17 A. No.

20:09:24 18 Q. Do you know where it would range in terms of  
20:09:26 19 population total, or population density since that  
20:09:30 20 seemed to be important to your presentation after the  
20:09:34 21 last time?

20:09:34 22 A. I don't know the range, no sir.

20:09:36 23 Q. Hackensack is 47. Now, a little earlier tonight  
20:09:42 24 in response -- and again, this is one of the questions  
20:09:44 25 you were asked about cost and revenue projections, it was

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20:09:54 1 in a form of a question concerning --

20:09:54 2 A. I recall one prior.

20:09:58 3 Q. Do you recall being asked on more than one  
20:10:00 4 occasion about the costs putting up this facility?

20:10:02 5 A. Yes, I do.

20:10:04 6 Q. My recollection is you indicated when asked about  
20:10:08 7 the underground parking, the cost of bringing that up to  
20:10:14 8 the theoretical number that the board suggested than  
20:10:18 9 leaving it where it is at, you have no idea how much that  
20:10:22 10 would --

20:10:22 11 A. I don't believe I responded to the question that  
20:10:24 12 was put forth by Mr. Diktas.

20:10:28 13 Q. No, I don't think you responded to it either. I  
20:10:30 14 just wanted to know if you recall that. And in response  
20:10:34 15 to the question how much it would cost to put this  
20:10:36 16 building up, you said you could help us out a little bit  
20:10:40 17 with the dollar per square foot.

20:10:42 18 A. A range of dollars per square foot.

20:10:44 19 Q. And your range was 200 dollars a square

20:10:48 20 foot.  
20:10:48 21 A. Yes.  
20:10:50 22 Q. So as you stand here now during this  
20:10:52 23 application process, after having spent four million  
20:10:56 24 plus to buy this land, Lord knows what other consultants  
20:11:00 25 that are coming and going, you don't know how much it is

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20:11:04 1 going to cost. You have 100 percent variance what you  
20:11:08 2 think the cost of it will be after you've been in the  
20:11:12 3 business of running these facilities, and building them  
20:11:14 4 for many, many years, and you ask us to believe that?  
20:11:16 5 A. You believe what you want to believe. We have not  
20:11:20 6 prepared a detailed cost estimate.  
20:11:22 7 Q. That's a different question. I understand you  
20:11:24 8 don't know how much of buzzer will cost in the hospital  
20:11:34 9 or every plaque or doorknob. You're suggesting, at least  
20:11:34 10 your testimony to date, you really have not much of an  
20:11:38 11 idea at all? It is either going to cost X or two X or  
20:11:40 12 something else. You don't know how much, and you don't  
20:11:44 13 know how long you're going to have to run it to make  
20:11:50 14 money and you don't know how much it is going to cost to  
20:11:54 15 do the things. Do you expect us to believe that?  
20:11:56 16 A. I said you believe what you want to believe.  
20:11:58 17 Q. I really won't. I certainly would not believe  
20:12:02 18 what you would like me to believe.  
20:12:08 19 When did you higher Boswell to do the traffic  
20:12:10 20 study that you hired them to do?  
20:12:14 21 A. Some time in the Spring of 2008.  
20:12:16 22 Q. Some time in the Spring. Was that at or about the  
20:12:20 23 same time you hired Boswell to do the site plan and the  
20:12:22 24 Zoning permit application?  
20:12:26 25 A. We hired them to prepare a site plan and a

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20:12:28 1 traffic study for the project.

20:12:32 2 Q. And that information is included in the  
20:12:34 3 materials that you put in with your Zoning application,  
20:12:38 4 correct?

20:12:38 5 A. It was included. But I'll let our attorney  
20:12:40 6 address that further.

20:12:46 7 Q. Did you let Boswell see your zoning application  
20:12:52 8 before they prepared their traffic study?

20:12:56 9 A. They prepared their traffic study before the  
20:12:58 10 Zoning application was prepared or submitted.

20:13:00 11 Q. They prepared their study.

20:13:00 12 A. Yes.

20:13:04 13 Q. I think that's not true. Was that study not  
20:13:06 14 turned in December 8 of 2008?

20:13:10 15 A. The original study was submitted in December of  
20:13:12 16 2008, that's correct.

20:13:14 17 Q. And the Zoning application was submitted in June  
20:13:20 18 of 2008?

20:13:24 19 A. The application was submitted. I don't know the  
20:13:26 20 exact date. I'll take your word for it if you say it was  
20:13:30 21 submitted in June 2008.

20:13:30 22 Q. The early part of June?

20:13:32 23 A. Yes. But the materials to support that  
20:13:34 24 application I believe were submitted in November and  
20:13:38 25 December. I don't know the exact date, but our attorney

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20:13:40 1 can address that. And I'm sure the board is well aware  
20:13:44 2 of the date.

20:13:44 3 Q. Did your attorney prepare the parking study?

20:13:48 4 A. I don't think he's equipped or prepared to do  
20:13:48 5 that.

20:13:54 6 Q. Do you recall when Boswell conducted their  
20:13:58 7 study, that is when they put their people out on the  
20:14:02 8 corner to count traffic?

20:14:02 9 A. I think the traffic counts were part --

20:14:08 10 Q. I know that. I asked you about the traffic  
20:14:10 11 counts.

20:14:10 12 A. I'm trying to address your question. Be fair  
20:14:12 13 with me.

20:14:12 14 Q. I'm going to wish and continue to hope that you'll  
20:14:16 15 answer my questions.

20:14:18 16 The question that I asked, not what you would like  
20:14:22 17 me to ask, I asked you if you recall when the traffic  
20:14:26 18 studies, traffic counts, the traffic counts were taken  
20:14:30 19 that form the basis of the traffic study?

20:14:34 20 A. I do not know as I stand here the exact dates  
20:14:38 21 or date that the traffic counts were taken.  
20:14:42 22 Q. If I might refresh your recollection, it was  
20:14:44 23 April 30th and May first.  
20:14:48 24 MR. BASRALIAN: Excuse me, Mr. Chairman.  
20:14:48 25 The direction of these questions is as to his testimony.

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20:14:52 1 Not as to when the traffic study, which has not yet been  
20:14:56 2 discussed before the board, was prepared and when the  
20:14:58 3 data was prepared. The questions Mr. Moskowitz should be  
20:15:00 4 directed to ask, is the testimony of last week, and any  
20:15:04 5 statements made today. And it doesn't deal with a  
20:15:06 6 parking study. All these questions you could ask  
20:15:08 7 certainly of the consultant when he comes forth.  
20:15:14 8 MR. MOSKOWITZ: Mr. Basralian, I believe  
20:15:16 9 the record will show on more than one occasion Mr.  
20:15:18 10 Pineles responded with respect to what his traffic study  
20:15:22 11 showed, what his parking study showed, what the Zoning  
20:15:26 12 laws are. The questions with respect to traffic and his  
20:15:30 13 study and his consultants --  
20:15:32 14 MR. BASRALIAN: In addition, he also  
20:15:34 15 referred them, and you'll have to wait for the traffic  
20:15:36 16 consultant. That's where they should be addressed. Such  
20:15:38 17 as engineering questions and architectural questions  
20:15:40 18 should be addressed. His reference when he made the  
20:15:44 19 statement was, you must go to those witnesses for that  
20:15:48 20 information that you seek from prior questions, will be  
20:15:50 21 in the report and in the testimony.  
20:15:52 22 MR. MOSKOWITZ: Mr. Malagiere, I'm not  
20:15:52 23 asking for expert testimony. This is the man who has  
20:15:58 24 represented here, who gave the engagement instructions to  
20:16:10 25 the consultants as to what they wish to learn and what

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20:16:10 1 they wish to be studied. I'm not asking anything about  
20:16:12 2 that. I want to know a little bit about the instructions  
20:16:18 3 that the management of Bergen Passaic LTACH gave to its  
20:16:18 4 traffic consultant.

20:16:22 5 MR. MALAGIERE: Mr. Chairman, there is  
20:16:24 6 wide latitude offered in cross-examination, especially in  
20:16:26 7 settings such as these where people live in the area.  
20:16:30 8 Cases consistently found, they're more suited than not to  
20:16:34 9 ask questions, even the board itself. I suggest that the  
20:16:40 10 cross-examination be allowed to continue.

20:16:42 11 THE CHAIRMAN: I agree.

20:16:44 12 MR. MOSKOWITZ: Thank you. I was going to  
20:16:52 13 ask the reporter to read back the question.

20:16:52 14 REPORTER READ QUESTION AS REQUESTED.

20:17:04 15 MR. BASRALIAN: I'm going to renew my  
20:17:06 16 objection. Although there is some latitude, within that  
20:17:08 17 testimony, but to ask about a traffic report that hasn't  
20:17:16 18 been submitted yet, is inappropriate.

20:17:16 19 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you. The Chairman  
20:17:18 20 has ruled.

20:17:18 21 MR. MOSKOWITZ: I'll ask a little  
20:17:32 22 different question.

20:17:32 23 Q. Mr. Pineles, in your company, I gather from your  
20:17:36 24 testimony, you're the person in charge of this project,  
20:17:38 25 correct?

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20:17:38 1 A. That is correct.

20:17:42 2 Q. You're the person that made the decision to  
20:17:46 3 hire Boswell, to do the traffic and parking study,  
20:17:48 4 correct?

20:17:48 5 A. That's correct.

20:17:50 6 Q. Do you have a letter of engagement or instruction  
20:17:58 7 to them? How did they know what you wanted them to do?

20:18:00 8 A. We did have a letter of agreement detailing --

20:18:02 9 Q. -- what you wanted them to do.

20:18:04 10 A. Yes.

20:18:06 11 Q. That's not included in the traffic report.

20:18:10 12 A. No.

20:18:12 13 MR. MOSKOWITZ: Might I respectfully ask  
20:18:14 14 the board to make a request for that document?

20:18:18 15 MR. BASRALIAN: I would object. It is a  
20:18:24 16 letter of engagement to retain a consultant. It doesn't  
20:18:26 17 contain instructions as to what they will do and what  
20:18:26 18 their findings will be. It is an engagement, and in a  
20:18:26 19 summary aspect what they will provide for this



20:18:36 20 applicant. There is no written instruction what their  
20:18:36 21 conclusion should be. They're the professionals, they  
20:18:40 22 come up with the conclusions.  
20:18:42 23 MR. MALAGIERE: Just so the record is  
20:18:42 24 clear, you're refusing to produce the document  
20:18:44 25 MR. BASRALIAN: I'm refusing to provide

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20:18:46 1 an engagement letter between two private individuals on  
20:18:50 2 retaining a consultant, yes.  
20:18:54 3 MR. MALAGIERE: Okay. Thank you.  
20:18:56 4 MR. MOSKOWITZ: I'm going to renew my  
20:18:58 5 request for the board, we'll look at the proper legal  
20:19:02 6 authority. I wasn't asking how much it cost. I know it  
20:19:02 7 costs a lot.  
20:19:02 8 BY MR. MOSKOWITZ:  
20:19:08 9 Q. Did you give any guidance or direction to your  
20:19:12 10 traffic consultant about general traffic in the area,  
20:19:14 11 anything like that?  
20:19:16 12 A. Not about general traffic in the area, no.  
20:19:22 13 Q. Did you know that they made their street  
20:19:28 14 counts April 30 and May 1, of 2008. I represented that  
20:19:32 15 to you, and it is true.  
20:19:34 16 A. If that's what you read, and that's the date,  
20:19:36 17 then I'll take your word for it.  
20:19:40 18 Q. And you spend some of your time working in  
20:19:44 19 Hackensack over at the other facility?  
20:19:46 20 A. I do.  
20:19:46 21 Q. That's more or less your headquarters and  
20:19:50 22 regency headquarters.  
20:19:50 23 A. The facilities are located where they are  
20:19:54 24 located.  
20:19:56 25 Q. Does that mean yes?

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20:19:56 1 A. If you could rephrase or make your question  
20:20:00 2 a little clearer, I could answer it more clearly.  
20:20:00 3 Q. That's at least now, the current listed  
20:20:04 4 headquarters of this LTACH.  
20:20:06 5 A. Which address are you speaking of?  
20:20:10 6 Q. I'm speaking of the one that you would like  
20:20:12 7 to build on prospect.  
20:20:12 8 A. The address that we intend, and we applied for,  
20:20:14 9 is 329 Prospect.  
20:20:18 10 Q. But that's not your current address, is it?  
20:20:20 11 A. I have an office.  
20:20:20 12 Q. The corporate search and the record say 233  
20:20:26 13 Prospect.  
20:20:26 14 A. 336 Prospect is the address of Prospect Heights  
20:20:32 15 Care Center. What is your question specifically of me,  
20:20:34 16 sir?  
20:20:34 17 Q. My question to you, you come to work at Prospect  
20:20:34 18 Avenue?  
20:20:34 19 A. Yes, I do.  
20:20:44 20 Q. Were you aware last April or May of the  
20:20:46 21 traffic conditions outstanding, the general area here,  
20:20:50 22 relating to the project at hand, and other sources of  
20:20:56 23 collateral streets, created a very unique disorientation,  
20:21:04 24 disruption, and discontinuity in traffic in Hackensack  
20:21:04 25 and the general area as been seen in 20 or 30 years?

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20:21:10 1 A. I'm not familiar with the condition.  
20:21:12 2 Q. Do you know the bridge, the Essex Street Bridge  
20:21:16 3 was closed?  
20:21:16 4 A. I did know it was closed for approximately a  
20:21:18 5 year, a year and a half, yes.  
20:21:20 6 Q. Did you know it caused great disruption,  
20:21:28 7 disorientation and different traffic directions in the  
20:21:28 8 area?  
20:21:28 9 A. To some people in some streets, in some  
20:21:30 10 neighborhoods, yes.  
20:21:32 11 Q. Would you know of any reason why your  
20:21:34 12 traffic consultant didn't make a study seven weeks  
20:21:42 13 later, on July first that bridge was opened, and that  
20:21:44 14 traffic returned to its normal pattern?  
20:21:46 15 A. I don't know the answer. You have to ask  
20:21:48 16 them.  
20:21:48 17 Q. Did you ask them?  
20:21:50 18 A. No. I don't know the answer to your  
20:21:52 19 question. You have to ask them.

20:21:52 20 Q. Did you read their traffic report?  
20:21:54 21 A. Yes, I did.  
20:21:56 22 Q. Did it mention a word about it?  
20:21:58 23 A. I don't recall having read that, no.  
20:22:00 24 Q. No, you didn't. Are you aware when your traffic  
20:22:10 25 consultant did their counts, their study, and made their

20:22:12 1 projections, that they forgot the newly constituted  
20:22:18 2 Bergen Mall was opening?  
20:22:22 3 A. Again, I think you best pose that question to  
20:22:26 4 the traffic engineer.  
20:22:26 5 Q. But they worked for you. I can't pose it to  
20:22:28 6 them?  
20:22:30 7 A. Certainly you can.  
20:22:32 8 Q. If they didn't raise it when they worked for  
20:22:34 9 me, since you're asking about this, you wouldn't be my  
20:22:38 10 traffic consultant.  
20:22:42 11 So isn't it true, you read that report that the  
20:22:46 12 opening of a, I guess it is about 130 thousand square  
20:22:56 13 foot Target store was taking place after they did their  
20:22:56 14 study?  
20:23:00 15 A. I think as we stand here and sit here today,  
20:23:04 16 we all know the Target store opened up at the Bergen  
20:23:06 17 Mall, yes.  
20:23:06 18 Q. And you think your guy may not have known  
20:23:10 19 anything on the Bergen Mall a year earlier?  
20:23:14 20 A. I can't speak for any one.  
20:23:18 21 Q. They missed the sneaker store too.  
20:23:20 22 A. They may have. You have to ask them.  
20:23:26 23 Q. In fact, what happened was, that after your  
20:23:32 24 traffic study was done, all though, it was certainly  
20:23:36 25 known to become one of the biggest additions of retail

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20:23:42 1 space since 1996 when the Garden State Plaza was opened,  
20:23:48 2 are you aware of that?  
20:23:50 3 A. I'm not aware of those statistics, but okay.  
20:23:54 4 Q. You knew that a lot -- well, maybe we should make  
20:23:58 5 it more simple. You knew that a lot of the big stores  
20:24:02 6 and big spaces were going to be opening up down the block  
20:24:04 7 from some of the key intersections.  
20:24:08 8 A. I guess its argumentative, there's a question  
20:24:10 9 as to whether the Bergen Mall or Bergen Town Center, as  
20:24:14 10 it is currently known, is down the block from our  
20:24:16 11 proposed site. I don't believe it is down the block.

20:24:18 12 Q. It is closer than some bus stops you expect  
20:24:20 13 your workers to get the buses from. That was 300  
20:24:28 14 thousand square feet, a brand new retail space with just  
20:24:32 15 four stores alone, down the block on Passaic. As far as  
20:24:40 16 you recall, you knew nothing about that in this traffic  
20:24:46 17 study?

20:24:46 18 A. You stated in your question, and I concurred,  
20:24:48 19 that I don't believe the Bergen Town Center or the  
20:24:50 20 Bergen Mall was referenced in our traffic study.

20:24:54 21 Q. If you had to make the guy do it again  
20:24:58 22 today, wouldn't you think, in the interest of  
20:25:00 23 recognizing reality, rather than some convoluted theory,  
20:25:04 24 you would have reminded them?

20:25:06 25 MR. BASRALIAN: I'm going to direct the

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20:25:08 1 witness not to testify. He's not a traffic expert and  
20:25:10 2 that's for a traffic consultant, an expert to do. He  
20:25:12 3 didn't give them direction how to do their job. I direct  
20:25:16 4 him not to answer.

20:25:16 5 MR. MOSKOWITZ: Mr. Malagiere, I  
20:25:20 6 represented in a way, we're all lay witnesses.

20:25:22 7 MR. MALAGIERE: I agree. You're an  
20:25:22 8 attorney.

20:25:22 9 MR. MOSKOWITZ: Yes.

20:25:30 10 MR. MALAGIERE: I agree with the  
20:25:30 11 question proponent. This is a question that can be  
20:25:34 12 answered. I don't agree counsel directing his witness  
20:25:40 13 not to answer on the basis it requires expert testimony.  
20:25:40 14 I request the witness answer the question.

20:25:44 15 MR. BASRALIAN: The question was whether  
20:25:44 16 or not he would direct him to take those things into  
20:25:48 17 consideration. I said he's not an expert. He doesn't  
20:25:50 18 give the direction to the consultant. He doesn't tell  
20:25:52 19 them how to do their job. They made an error, if it's  
20:25:56 20 improper than Mr. Moskowitz and everyone has a right,  
20:26:00 21 through cross-examination of the expert when they  
20:26:00 22 appear.

20:26:02 23 MR. MALAGIERE: Objection noted. No  
20:26:04 24 further argument on the objection. I believe the  
20:26:06 25 question stands and should be answered. Mr. Basralian,

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20:26:08 1 do you stand on your objection? Do you direct your  
20:26:12 2 witness not to answer it?

20:26:12 3 MR. BASRALIAN: I do not believe he's  
20:26:18 4 informed and can answer the question. He can answer the  
20:26:22 5 question, but I will state my objection, it is  
20:26:26 6 inappropriate to direct a lay person how he would  
20:26:28 7 instruct a traffic consultant to undertake his work.

20:26:32 8 MR. MALAGIERE: Let's make sure we  
20:26:32 9 understand the question, if you would, Beth, please read  
20:26:32 10 it back.

20:26:32 11 THE QUESTIONS WAS READ BY THE REPORTER AS  
20:26:32 12 REQUESTED.

20:28:50 13 MR. MALAGIERE: Answer the question,  
20:28:50 14 sir.

20:28:52 15 THE WITNESS: Yes, I would give the  
20:28:52 16 traffic engineer the same instruction today as I gave  
20:28:56 17 them back in the Spring of 2008, which is to prepare a  
20:28:58 18 traffic study that would evaluate both the traffic and  
20:29:02 19 parking needs of the proposed facility. And the  
20:29:06 20 specifics on how they go about preparing that study and  
20:29:10 21 what they deem appropriate or important to consider, I  
20:29:14 22 would leave that to them today as I left it to them back  
20:29:18 23 when they were engaged.

20:29:22 24 Q. I just want to tell you that's an  
20:29:26 25 interesting answer, but it isn't exactly an answer to

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20:29:26 1 the question that I posed.

20:29:28 2 Would you tell, when you read the report,  
20:29:32 3 and you noticed your traffic consultant missed 300  
20:29:38 4 thousand square feet of brand new retail space in the  
20:29:42 5 traffic area, and failed to notice that the bridge, the  
20:29:50 6 Essex Street Bridge had been finished, would you think  
20:29:50 7 that to be a rather poor excuse of judgement on their  
20:29:56 8 part?

20:29:58 9 A. No.

20:29:58 10 Q. I just want to ask you one quick thing. You were  
20:30:06 11 asked a question before about the medical waste disposal.  
20:30:10 12 How often do you expect medical waste to be disposed of  
20:30:14 13 at this facility?

20:30:16 14 A. As often as --

20:30:16 15 Q. By the facility itself, rather than in each room?

20:30:22 16 A. Okay. It would be disposed of as often as is  
20:30:28 17 needed. Depending on the amount of storage capacity  
20:30:32 18 that's available to store that waste, until it needs to  
20:30:36 19 be removed or disposed of.

20:30:38 20 Q. Have you ever made an estimate of how often that  
20:30:42 21 would be?

20:30:42 22 A. No.

20:30:44 23 Q. To your knowledge, has anybody ever made an  
20:30:46 24 estimate of how often that would be, and given that  
20:30:48 25 estimate to your traffic consultants?

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20:30:52 1 A. To our traffic consultants, the answer is no.

20:30:52 2 Q. Absolutely no.

20:30:56 3 A. I can only say it so many ways.

20:31:00 4 Q. How often do you expect to dispose of the rest of  
20:31:00 5 the garbage at this site?

20:31:04 6 A. We expect the bulk of waste that would be  
20:31:08 7 removed from the facility, to be removed once every two  
20:31:12 8 weeks by way of a self-contained compactor.

20:31:16 9 Q. That's all waste, one garbage truck every two  
20:31:20 10 weeks.

20:31:20 11 A. We would have -- we propose to have on-site a  
20:31:24 12 self-contained compactor that would accommodate that  
20:31:28 13 waste, the general waste of the facility for up to two  
20:31:32 14 weeks time.

20:31:32 15 Q. So you know that. But you don't know how  
20:31:34 16 much the building would cost.

20:31:42 17 Thank you for your patience with me, Mr.  
20:31:44 18 Pineles. I thank the board and Mr. Malagiere. I've  
20:31:48 19 taken enough time, but I'm sure we'll get to chat again.

20:31:54 20 THE CHAIRMAN: We will take a short  
21 break.

22 MR.MALAGIERE: We will take a brief

2 NORMA TEMPEL: Norma Tempel, 326 Prospect

3 Street, Apt. 11-G, Sworn. QUESTIONS BY MS. TEMPEL.

20:49:02 4 Q. I'm very concerned about the traffic issue  
20:49:02 5 on our street. When you try to go on Summit, as somebody  
20:49:08 6 already testified, I'm not going to repeat that, it is a  
20:49:10 7 big problem. It is impossible to come from the other  
20:49:14 8 direction from the mall to make a left turn to get onto  
20:49:16 9 Passaic Street. Last night at 5:30 the traffic on  
20:49:22 10 Prospect was backed up from Passaic, past the World  
20:49:30 11 Plaza. I tried to get out at 11 o'clock one evening and

20:49:36 12 I couldn't get out of the driveway. There was so much  
20:49:40 13 traffic on Prospect because of the Restaurant down the  
20:49:42 14 street.  
20:49:42 15 I do not believe you, when you say that  
20:49:46 16 there's going to ten vans coming in and out with the  
20:49:52 17 dialysis patients, not everybody is going to come in a  
20:49:54 18 van. So you're talking about bringing in hundreds of  
20:49:58 19 cars onto our street. Now, there's more empty seats  
20:50:02 20 here than there were before we had the break. But I  
20:50:04 21 want you to look around. How many people here are 65 or  
20:50:10 22 older? Would you please raise your hand?  
20:50:10 23 AUDIENCE MEMBERS COMPLY  
20:50:18 24 MS. TEMPEL: We are trying to tell you  
20:50:18 25 something. You are invading our neighborhood and you're

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20:50:24 1 going to destroy it. At six o'clock in the morning, the  
20:50:28 2 bus that goes to the City, the commuter bus starts  
20:50:30 3 there are people crossing the streets. There are going  
20:50:34 4 to be trucks going in and out, and how can you stand  
20:50:36 5 there and say that it is not going to affect us.  
20:50:40 6 AUDIENCE MEMBER: What about the air  
20:50:40 7 planes?  
20:50:46 8 MR. MALAGIERE: Hold on, hold on. Do you  
20:50:50 9 want him to respond?  
20:50:50 10 THE WITNESS: Is there a question?  
20:50:52 11 MR. MALAGIERE: There's a question, how  
20:50:54 12 can you say it is not going to affect us. Is that the  
20:50:56 13 question?  
20:50:56 14 A. I don't believe that the traffic generated by our  
20:51:00 15 proposed facility will significantly affect -- you asked  
20:51:08 16 the question, I gave it to you.  
20:51:08 17 MR. MALAGIERE: The question has been --  
20:51:08 18 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: SOUNDS  
20:51:12 19 Q. You're aware our building had to put a fence  
20:51:14 20 up between us and Prospect Heights because people were  
20:51:18 21 parking in our guest parking. You don't have enough  
20:51:20 22 parking for your employees over there. They are using  
20:51:24 23 the parking lot. There is no parking on the street.  
20:51:28 24 Where do you expect all of the people to park?  
20:51:32 25 A. All of which people, excuse me?

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20:51:34 1 Q. Your employees, your visitors?

20:51:36 2 MR. MALAGIERE: In the new facility.

20:51:38 3 Q. In both facilities?

20:51:40 4 A. I think I've stated, as well as it is on the  
20:51:44 5 record at numerous times from last month's meeting, and  
20:51:48 6 tonight's meeting, and you'll hear the number and the  
20:51:52 7 amount of parking we're providing quite a few more times  
20:51:54 8 during the course of this application, but I strongly  
20:51:56 9 believe that we're providing adequate parking for all of  
20:52:02 10 the needs of the proposed Bergen Passaic LTACH facility,  
20:52:06 11 both for visitors and for patients and staff alike.

20:52:10 12 Q. Now, let's address an issue of pollution. Have you  
20:52:14 13 done a study on pollution?

20:52:16 14 A. No, I did not.

20:52:18 15 Q. All of the fumes from all of those vans and the  
20:52:20 16 buses and all of the extra noise, is not a consideration  
20:52:24 17 to you?

20:52:24 18 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: SOUNDS.

20:52:30 19 MR. MALAGIERE: Hold on please. The person  
20:52:32 20 asking the question is the only one recognized by the  
20:52:34 21 Chairman to speak. Please respect that. The Chairman can  
20:52:40 22 impose a time limit on people, he'd chosen not to. He  
20:52:42 23 understands how important this is to the people in the  
20:52:44 24 audience. Please show the respect back. Thank you.

20:52:50 25 Miss Temple, will you please pose the

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20:52:52 1 question again with regard to the pollution?

20:53:00 2 Q. Sir, why haven't you engaged a vehicle and  
20:53:04 3 noise pollution study, is that accurate? I'm concerned  
20:53:10 4 about noise pollution, the fumes from the vehicles, light  
20:53:14 5 pollution from the building.

20:53:16 6 MR. MALAGIERE: Why haven't you engaged  
20:53:18 7 any of those studies, sir?

20:53:20 8 A. I think this general topic was brought up at the  
20:53:22 9 last meeting. Let me repeat what I said at that time.  
20:53:26 10 None of the vehicles that either facility that we're  
20:53:28 11 using or visitors alike, patients, staff, are any  
20:53:34 12 different than any vehicles used in the community. In  
20:53:38 13 fact, there's a good possibility some of the vehicles  
20:53:38 14 that we will use at the facility are significantly  
20:53:42 15 better in terms of pollution than traditionally most  
20:53:46 16 buses and vans used in Hackensack and throughout the  
20:53:52 17 country. We are seriously looking at the possibility of  
20:53:54 18 using vehicles that are powered by compressed natural  
20:53:56 19 gas, also known as CNG power that emit virtually no



20:53:56 20 noxious emissions. That's one thing. We are obviously  
20:54:10 21 looking into having all of our vans powered that way.  
20:54:12 22 In terms of what the staff and public and what people  
20:54:14 23 drive, we have no control over that. Like I couldn't  
20:54:18 24 tell you you what type of vehicle to drive or anyone in  
20:54:20 25 the audience here tonight. I'll leave that to the

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20:54:22 1 governmental authority to do that.  
20:54:24 2 Q. The other issue is that I know other  
20:54:28 3 properties down River Road along the railroad track that  
20:54:28 4 could be had, I suggest instead of ruining our  
20:54:36 5 neighborhood, that you look elsewhere to put your  
20:54:36 6 facility.  
20:54:36 7 BARBARA RUBIN: Barbara Rubin, 326  
20:54:36 8 Prospect Unit 210, Sworn.  
20:55:16 9 MR. MALAGIERE: I recognize you from the  
20:55:16 10 last time, did you speak at the last meeting?  
20:55:16 11 Ms. RUBIN: Yes.  
20:55:18 12 MR. MALAGIERE: I please ask you to limit  
20:55:20 13 your comments, and also if you could respectfully limit  
20:55:24 14 it to the topics that not yet have been asked.  
20:55:24 15 QUESTIONS BY MS. RUBIN:  
20:55:28 16 Q. Mr. Pineles, as I was leaving after the last  
20:55:30 17 meeting, you were asked about where you live and you  
20:55:34 18 said Verona. And this lady over here (indicating) said  
20:55:38 19 why don't you build it there? So when I left I saw you  
20:55:42 20 standing with your attorney and I said, do you know that  
20:55:48 21 was a very good idea, why don't you build it there? And  
20:55:50 22 your attorney looked at me and he said, not in my  
20:55:54 23 backyard, right? And I wasn't quick enough to answer,  
20:55:58 24 but I am answering him now. It is not in my backyard, it  
20:56:02 25 is in my front yard. I live right next door to you.

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20:56:14 1 And I have windows all around my apartment, and  
20:56:20 2 yesterday morning I looked out and there was traffic on  
20:56:22 3 the street and I'm saying what's going on? It is only  
20:56:26 4 like ten o'clock in the morning, and I looked and it was  
20:56:28 5 into your driveway. Cars and ambulances that were  
20:56:34 6 holding up that whole street with traffic. Now, you only  
20:56:36 7 have seven floors.  
20:56:38 8 Now we're discussing what kind of cars,  
20:56:40 9 and what kind of emissions. The question isn't  
20:56:46 10 emissions, it is how many cars that you're going to have  
20:56:48 11 there. And you don't seem to have any regards for this

20:56:54 12 community. You only care, as the gentleman said, about  
20:56:56 13 the cost of making a profit and picking up this  
20:56:58 14 property. Again, you even bid on that property, I guess  
20:57:04 15 you wanted it desperately. You keep saying to the people  
20:57:10 16 on Summit Avenue it is going to face Prospect Avenue. I  
20:57:14 17 think that's wonderful. It is going to face me. I'm  
20:57:16 18 right there, across from that property.  
20:57:18 19 Now, do you think it is right to impact

20:57:36 23 think it is the right thing to do? Is it a moral thing  
20:57:40 24 to do, or is it more of a business thing to do? Do you  
20:57:48 25 have any sense of morality in where you build?

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20:57:52 1 MR. MALAGIERE: Can you respond to that?

20:57:54 2 THE WITNESS: I can, yes.

20:57:56 3 MR. MALAGIERE: Please.

20:57:56 4 THE WITNESS: We make no bones about the

20:57:58 5 fact this is a business enterprise that we are engaged

20:58:02 6 in, and propose this facility at this site. What I want

20:58:06 7 to add, you're doing something that gives a service to

20:58:12 8 your neighbors and the community.

20:58:14 9 Q. I have to decide that, not you.

20:58:20 10 A. We're basing that on a need established by

20:58:24 11 the State of New Jersey and the health authorities and

20:58:24 12 the governmental authorities. But in terms of your

20:58:28 13 question, whether it is moral, I have no moral

20:58:34 14 compunction. I believe in the project. I believe it is

20:58:36 15 good. You may not like it individually, but I think it

20:58:38 16 is good for the community.

20:58:40 17 Q. Is it good for my neighborhood where I'm living?

20:58:42 18 A. I believe it is, ma'am.

20:58:44 19 Q. Oh you do. Now on the --

20:58:44 20 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: SOUND.

20:58:48 21 THE CHAIRMAN: Please.

20:58:48 22 Q. Now, on the north side of our building --

20:58:54 23 MR. MALAGIERE: What's our building?

20:58:54 24 MS. RUBIN: 336.

20:58:58 25 MR. MALAGIERE: Are you familiar with the

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20:59:00 1 building?

20:59:00 2 Q. You're on the right side of our building.

20:59:02 3 There was a fence and what happened, you had your people

20:59:08 4 cutting across, parking in our guest parking lot, and

20:59:10 5 cutting across into your building to go to work. And it

20:59:16 6 was dangerous. There were open spaces of fence. About

20:59:24 7 two years ago we got in touch with you, whoever you are,

20:59:28 8 and we said would you do something about this? We never

20:59:34 9 got a response. We had asked again. We never got a

20:59:38 10 response. You say you care about safety, but obviously

20:59:40 11 really you don't care about safety, even about your

20:59:44 12 employees and our safety.

20:59:46 13 A. Now, let me address that. I would like to

20:59:48 14 respond to it. At no time did I, or anybody in my

20:59:52 15 organization, recommend or direct any of our employees to

20:59:56 16 park on your property. Everybody knows in this society

20:59:58 17 that people park where they want to park. Whether it is

21:00:00 18 proper, illegal or not. In fact, I can tell you the

21:00:06 19 parking lot that is on the premises of Prospect Heights

21:00:10 20 Center, we have many neighboring buildings who park in

21:00:12 21 our garage. I didn't ask them to come, they are not

21:00:18 22 authorized or permitted, but they have done that. I heard

21:00:22 23 someone mention earlier about a fence that was up. We

21:00:46 5 MR. MALAGIERE: Ma'am, what's the next

21:00:48 6 question you would like to ask. We understand your

21:00:52 7 concern. I don't mean to minimize them.

21:00:54 8 Q. All I'm saying, about the beauty of Summit

21:01:00 9 Avenue. It's the show place of Hackensack. My son-in-law

21:01:02 10 who lives in a beautiful area of Warren never seen Summit

21:01:06 11 Avenue, he happened to be coming down on Sunday and said,

21:01:10 12 oh my God, this is Hackensack? This is beautiful. How

21:01:14 13 come I never seen it. Well, it is a beautiful street and

21:01:18 14 he said you're not kidding, I'm surprised it is in

21:01:20 15 Hackensack. You want to destroy that, right?

21:01:24 16 A. No ma'am.

21:01:24 17 Q. No, you don't want to build a 24-story building?

21:01:28 18 I'm finished. You heard other people talking about this,

21:01:30 19 and you don't seem to have any concern. Everything that's

21:01:34 20 been said to you, you ignore.  
21:01:34 21 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you, ma'am.  
21:01:34 22 DR. CLIFFORD HAYNES: Dr. Clifford Haynes,  
21:01:34 23 194 Summit Avenue, Sworn. QUESTIONS BY DR. HAYNES:  
21:02:18 24 Q. I was thinking the last time, what I wanted  
21:02:18 25 to say when I got up here. When I heard about this

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21:02:22 1 building being built, I had a whole speech written. But  
21:02:26 2 it basically boils down to and I don't want to take a lot  
21:02:28 3 of time, it basically boils down to one comment, and  
21:02:32 4 three questions. The comment I have to say is, that I  
21:02:36 5 lived in Hackensack since 1957, and I live on Summit  
21:02:40 6 Avenue and been there for the last ten years. Parking  
21:02:48 7 congestion, crowdedness, not to mention the air planes  
21:02:52 8 which are understated, let's put it that way. It is  
21:02:54 9 affecting all of the people I know on my block, which is  
21:02:58 10 between Prospect, between Central and Essex, who have  
21:03:02 11 widened their driveways or put in circular driveways so  
21:03:06 12 that we have a place to park our cars, and we're able to  
21:03:10 13 get out onto Summit Avenue to go to work. The parking  
21:03:18 14 situation is bad. You don't need a traffic study for  
21:03:20 15 that, you have to open your eyes.  
21:03:22 16 My questions are three, one for you, the  
21:03:32 17 audience, one for Mr. Pineles and one for the board. If  
21:03:36 18 I may, I'll be brief. Number one, I'm mad as heck, how  
21:03:42 19 about you?  
21:03:42 20 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: SOUNDS.  
21:03:50 21 Q. I do wish more people from Summit Avenue were  
21:03:52 22 here. Number two, for Mr. Pineles, a simple question.  
21:03:58 23 Sir, what's in it for us, the residents of Hackensack,  
21:04:06 24 the people who live here, who pay taxes who have to put  
21:04:10 25 up with all of the traffic and congestion? What's in it

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21:04:14 1 for us? It's in the best interest, what do we get out of  
21:04:14 2 this?  
21:04:18 3 A. I believe that there's two main areas and  
21:04:26 4 benefits for the community. The first being, the  
21:04:28 5 proximity and projection of a significant amount of  
21:04:30 6 health care services.  
21:04:32 7 Q. We have Hackensack Hospital, that came to  
21:04:36 8 mind.  
21:04:36 9 A. Which will serve both you and you need them, and  
21:04:38 10 the audience and the general community needs them.  
21:04:42 11 Secondly, I believe that we will provide a significant

21:04:46 12 ratable for the City to help balance the budget here.  
21:04:52 13 Q. In my mind, I'm a doctor, the first thing you  
21:04:54 14 learn from day one in school was Primum non nocere. The  
21:05:00 15 first thing is to do no harm.  
21:05:00 16 A. I don't speak Latin.  
21:05:04 17 Q. But you're in the health care field, perhaps you  
21:05:06 18 should be familiar.  
21:05:12 19 A. I know the English version of it, yes.  
21:05:16 20 Q. I think that's being violated here.  
21:05:20 21 My third and final question to the board is,  
21:05:26 22 why are you even entertaining such a half baked untoward  
21:05:34 23 proposal that Mr. Pineles presented here? Is that  
21:05:38 24 required for over turning 20 variances? I've been here  
21:05:38 25 in the past. I saw Mr. Basralian represent the Pierre

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21:05:48 1 about parking. That's still not even resolved after two  
21:05:52 2 years. And I think (inaudible) is applying for Zoning  
21:06:00 3 variances, who had a better plan than this facility. I  
21:06:04 4 don't know why this even got presented here. And that's  
21:06:06 5 all I have to say. Thank you very much.  
21:06:06 6 FRANCES TREANOR: Frances Treanor, 277  
21:06:06 7 Prospect Unit 16F, Sworn. QUESTIONS BY M. TREANOR  
21:07:00 8 Q. I'm too puzzled why you're persevering when  
21:07:04 9 it is obviously to all of us, it is going to have an  
21:07:06 10 enormous impact on our lives. The man who just spoke  
21:07:12 11 asked why more people from Summit Avenue aren't here.  
21:07:14 12 Well, some of you are here. I believe the answer to that  
21:07:18 13 is there hasn't been much press yet. That is going to  
21:07:24 14 change. My question is about the traffic and it's a  
21:07:32 15 simple answer. How many ambulances and ambulets come to  
21:07:36 16 Prospect Heights everyday?  
21:07:40 17 A. I don't know the precise answer to that. I  
21:07:44 18 haven't made a study.  
21:07:44 19 AUDIENCE SOUNDS  
21:07:46 20 THE CHAIRMAN: Please let him answer.  
21:07:48 21 MR. MALAGIERE: Let the man respond.  
21:07:50 22 A. How many times did anybody go to the  
21:07:52 23 supermarket last year? I don't know the correct answer.  
21:07:56 24 I could give you an estimate.  
21:07:58 25 Q. I can answer that question.

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21:07:58 1 MR. MALAGIERE: Let him --

21:08:00 2 Q. I have a checkbook. I know when I go to the  
21:08:00 3 supermarket.

21:08:16 4 A. A 20 dollar bill when I go to the  
21:08:18 5 supermarket.

21:08:20 6 Q. Another sketchy answer. All of your answers were  
21:08:26 7 sketchy. And that brings me to my next question. You  
21:08:32 8 don't seem to have a grasp, maybe you do, it doesn't  
21:08:36 9 sound like it. I hear phrases like ballpark figure, 400  
21:08:38 10 square feet. What guarantee do we have and does this  
21:08:44 11 board have, with these kinds of sketchy answers and  
21:08:50 12 apparently not profound planning. What guarantee do we  
21:08:56 13 have that this project, should it be approved, and I  
21:09:00 14 certainly hope it is not, what guarantee do we have that  
21:09:06 15 it will be finished? Or will we be left with something  
21:09:10 16 that we don't want, maybe that might be better.

21:09:14 17 A. Can I respond to that?

21:09:16 18 MR. MALAGIERE: Of course.

21:09:16 19 Q. What guarantee?

21:09:16 20 A. We have made extensive preparations for this  
21:09:18 21 application. As many of you might be aware and we  
21:09:22 22 submitted, myself, along with all of the design  
21:09:26 23 professionals and other consultants that we have on this  
21:09:28 24 project, we have done voluminous amounts of work and  
21:09:32 25 submitted countless sets of plans and study reports etc

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21:09:36 1 cetera. And, you of course, are welcome to go read  
21:09:38 2 those as some of the members of the public have. I have  
21:09:42 3 been up in front of this board and the audience here for  
21:09:46 4 two sessions, and I have given a significant number of  
21:09:50 5 concrete specific facts and figures regarding our  
21:09:52 6 project. What I haven't given the board is some details,  
21:09:56 7 specifics that you and the audience are probably looking  
21:10:00 8 hungry for, to learn about the specifics from the  
21:10:04 9 architect, from the engineer, from the site engineer  
21:10:06 10 from the traffic engineer, from the planner. So, while  
21:10:12 11 you characterize some of my statements being sketchy,  
21:10:20 12 many of my questions that I suppose they're not given  
21:10:24 13 too specific or concrete answers, because every lead  
21:10:30 14 doesn't have a perfect recollection, or study. Specific  
21:10:32 15 questions posed to me, I've been direct as I can in  
21:10:36 16 answering the questions. And I think that if you allow  
21:10:38 17 myself and other witnesses to continue our testimony,  
21:10:42 18 you'll get many and more specifics than you'll hear from  
21:10:46 19 any other application before this board.

21:10:48 20 Q. Did that answer all of your questions?  
21:10:48 21 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: No.  
21:10:54 22 MR. MALAGIERE: Is there another  
21:10:54 23 question, ma'am?  
21:10:54 24 Q. My question was, and you didn't have an answer,  
21:11:00 25 how many ambulances, how many ambulets?

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21:11:00 1 A. And I started to answer it. If I could estimate,  
21:11:02 2 we would have somewhere between five and 15 ambulances  
21:11:06 3 on an average daily basis.  
21:11:08 4 Q. And that is going to quadruple if this  
21:11:10 5 project goes through.  
21:11:12 6 This is for the board. You serve without  
21:11:18 7 compensation. You all have a lot of experience. You're  
21:11:20 8 here to grant variances and make sure that the past  
21:11:26 9 zoning rulings (inaudible) are upheld. I would ask you  
21:11:32 10 to protect us from this kind of patent abuse of our  
21:11:38 11 lives for two years, at least when we are going to be  
21:11:44 12 subjected to construction vehicles. Is that not true,  
21:11:44 13 Mr. Pineles?  
21:11:48 14 A. What I would like to respond about your  
21:11:50 15 comment and observation regarding ambulances, some  
21:11:54 16 members of my family have availed themselves of the use  
21:11:58 17 of emergency vehicles and ambulance. And I'm sure many  
21:12:00 18 of the people in the audience and community have availed  
21:12:08 19 themselves of emergency vehicles. I don't know if you're  
21:12:08 20 suggesting to ban them from the streets of Hackensack or  
21:12:12 21 they are not necessary. Ambulances, unfortunately, are  
21:12:14 22 in our society and we use ambulances. When you need  
21:12:16 23 one, or I need one, we want to make sure they are there  
21:12:22 24 for us.  
21:12:22 25 Q. I don't think that's what I was leading up to.

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21:12:24 1 And I think you know that. I don't have anymore  
21:12:28 2 questions. I certainly hope this board will think very  
21:12:30 3 carefully about this issue. We are all here to protect,  
21:12:34 4 not only our own neighborhood, but the City of  
21:12:38 5 Hackensack.  
21:12:38 6 A. Thank you very much.  
21:12:38 7 RONEINO LUPPINO: Roneino Luppino, 140  
21:12:38 8 Jassamine Way, Fort Lee, Sworn. QUESTIONS BY MS.  
21:12:38 9 LUPPINO.  
21:12:38 10 Q. I own over 100 units, 316, 326, 344, 116  
21:13:30 11 Overlook Avenue. I believe many of the questions were

21:13:30 12 difficult for you, you had a difficult time answering.  
21:13:36 13 I'll keep them simple.  
21:13:36 14 REPORTER REQUESTED QUESTION TO BE REPEATED.  
21:13:36 15 Q. I said many of the questions have been  
21:13:38 16 relatively difficult for him to answer. I'm going to  
21:13:40 17 keep them easy. We know you live in Verona. Do you  
21:13:44 18 have a 24-story medical building next door to you?  
21:13:44 19 A. No.  
21:13:48 20 Q. Why not?  
21:13:48 21 A. No one built one.  
21:13:50 22 Q. Maybe because it is a residential area.  
21:13:54 23 That's the point here. This is a residential area. It  
21:13:58 24 is not commercially zoned. If you need a realtor to  
21:14:00 25 find you commercial property, I'm willing to help you

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21:14:02 1 because I'm a realtor. I'm also pretty sure there's not  
21:14:10 2 a hospital down the block from you that will filter  
21:14:12 3 patients to you, is that correct? If you were to build  
21:14:16 4 one next to your home and your family?  
21:14:20 5 A. There are hospitals.  
21:14:20 6 Q. Is there a hospital down the block from  
21:14:22 7 where you live?  
21:14:22 8 A. I wouldn't characterize it down the block,  
21:14:26 9 but it is a couple of miles away.  
21:14:26 10 Q. So Hackensack Hospital can filter the  
21:14:28 11 patients to you, yes?  
21:14:28 12 A. Yes.  
21:14:30 13 Q. Which will filter your pocketbook with cash.  
21:14:34 14 A. I wouldn't use the term filter. They  
21:14:36 15 discharge the patients, yes.  
21:14:38 16 Q. They're plenty of commercial areas in  
21:14:40 17 Hackensack. Essex Street, River Road. They all stated  
21:14:42 18 them. Why are you looking to plunk this monstrosity  
21:14:46 19 where we all live, where residents live, where these  
21:14:48 20 children grow up and where we're trying to create homes?  
21:14:52 21 A. I think you mentioned, Ms Luppino, you don't  
21:14:56 22 live in Hackensack. You live in Fort Lee.  
21:14:58 23 Q. My father built many of the beautiful  
21:15:00 24 residential buildings in Hackensack, so we are committed  
21:15:06 25 to this community and have been for over 45 years. I



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21:15:08 1 don't know about you, but my father and my family  
21:15:10 2 continue to support Hackensack and all of the residents  
21:15:14 3 that live there. So unless you want to live here next  
21:15:16 4 to it, I have 100 apartments that you could buy from me,  
21:15:20 5 if you'd like, otherwise --

21:15:22 6 A. Is that a question or an offer?

21:15:26 7 Q. It is an offer and a question.

21:15:26 8 LENNY NIX: I'll buy one.

21:15:32 9 Q. And I'm sure everyone else will sell them to  
21:15:34 10 you at a fair market value.

21:15:34 11 MR. MALAGIERE: Ms. Luppino.

21:15:40 12 MR. BASRALIAN: I've been stopped every  
21:15:40 13 time I've objected to long-winded statements, and I  
21:15:46 14 appreciate that Ms. Luppino and everybody want to make a  
21:15:48 15 statement. This isn't the proper place. If there are  
21:15:50 16 questions directed to, with respect to the project and  
21:15:52 17 his testimony, not general statements and for affect --

21:15:52 18 MR. MALAGIERE: Ms. Luppino, do you have  
21:16:00 19 any further questions?

21:16:00 20 MS. LUPPINO: Yes, yes, I do.

21:16:02 21 Q. Are you aware of a report by the Star Ledger  
21:16:04 22 on January 24th that stated that the State said there're  
21:16:08 23 too many hospital beds in Bergen County, Essex County,  
21:16:14 24 Hudson County and Passaic County?

21:16:14 25 A. I'm generally familiar with a report that was

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21:16:18 1 issued by the Blue Ribbon Commission, authorized by the  
21:16:22 2 Governor of the Department of Health. That report was  
21:16:24 3 referring to acute care hospitals, not the proposed  
21:16:28 4 type, the proposed facility that we have.

21:16:30 5 Q. You said it was acute care?

21:16:34 6 A. Yes, I did.

21:16:38 7 Q. You said it was an acute care.

21:16:40 8 A. I think I've elaborated at length what our  
21:16:44 9 proposed facility is. Let me do it again for you. Our  
21:16:46 10 proposed facility is what is known as a long term acute  
21:16:50 11 care hospital. It is not the same as an acute care  
21:16:54 12 hospital, such as Hackensack University Medical Center.  
21:16:58 13 It's not the same as an acute care hospital like Holy  
21:17:02 14 Name Hospital or as Englewood Hospital, as Valley  
21:17:04 15 Hospital or any of the normally known acute care  
21:17:06 16 hospitals. It is a speciality-type of hospital that's  
21:17:10 17 recognized by the New Jersey Department of Health and  
21:17:12 18 human Services and it is recognized by the Center for  
21:17:16 19 Medicare and Medicaid, the federal agency that handles

21:17:22 20 such facilities. The report that you alluded to, that  
21:17:22 21 was reported in the January article by the Bergen  
21:17:28 22 Record, and it was referencing and was studying, acute  
21:17:30 23 care hospitals. Distinct and different from the  
21:17:36 24 facility that we propose here.  
21:17:36 25 Q. My last question is, did you look anywhere

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21:17:44 1 else, did you look in any of the commercially zoned  
21:17:46 2 areas in Hackensack?  
21:17:48 3 A. I think that's what I stated at the last months  
21:17:50 4 meeting. We looked elsewhere and did not find a site  
21:17:54 5 that was appropriate or available to site this facility.  
21:17:58 6 Q. I think you should look again. Thank you.  
21:17:58 7 TERRACE BINDER: Terrace Binder, 245  
21:17:58 8 Prospect Street apt.8A, Sworn. QUESTIONS BY MR. BINDER:  
21:18:34 9 Q. Mr. Pineles, you mentioned that you've done  
21:18:38 10 studies regarding this proposed project and the one that  
21:18:42 11 I'm concerned about is, it has to do with the garage  
21:18:48 12 that's going to be underneath that whole property. The  
21:18:50 13 Prospect Avenue and Summit Avenue properties. Are you  
21:18:58 14 proposing it to be five stories, is that correct?  
21:19:00 15 A. Correct.  
21:19:00 16 Q. Have you done an environmental impact study that  
21:19:04 17 would address the geological impacts and water table  
21:19:10 18 impacts?  
21:19:10 19 A. No.  
21:19:10 20 Q. Is that kind of study required for a project like  
21:19:16 21 this?  
21:19:18 22 MR. MALAGIERE: Do you know, sir?  
21:19:18 23 THE WITNESS: I don't believe it is  
21:19:18 24 required, but I'll defer to my attorney to respond to  
21:19:18 25 that.

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21:19:22 1 MR. MALAGIERE: Actually, it would be to  
21:19:24 2 your engineer, but it's a good question and best probably  
21:19:26 3 posed to the site engineer when he testifies.  
21:19:32 4 MR. BINDER: That's all. Thank you very much.  
21:19:32 5 HOWARD SEARES: Howard Seares, 266 Summit  
21:19:34 6 Avenue, Sworn. QUESTIONS BY MR. SEARES:  
21:19:34 7 Q. First, I just want to make a statement and then I  
21:20:06 8 want to ask the board a question. Those of us that live  
21:20:06 9 in this town and spend any time on Summit Avenue or  
21:20:12 10 Prospect Avenue, in this area, know already how tough the  
21:20:16 11 traffic is and a project of this size and magnitude can

21:20:20 12 only make it terribly worse. I mean, you don't need  
21:20:24 13 engineers to understand that. And my question to the  
21:20:26 14 board is, how you can allow or let this project go  
21:20:32 15 forward with 22 variances that will destroy our  
21:20:36 16 neighborhood, and that's it.  
21:20:40 17 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you, sir.  
21:20:40 18 DR. KEVIN HEANEY: Dr. Kevin Heaney, 261  
21:20:40 19 Summit Avenue, sworn QUESTIONS BY DR. HEANEY:  
21:20:40 20 Q. I have a couple of questions about some  
21:21:10 21 things you have testified to in the past. One has to do  
21:21:12 22 with a number of beds. How many beds are you certified  
21:21:16 23 for?  
21:21:16 24 A. We're proposing to install 144 beds.  
21:21:20 25 Q. That wasn't what I asked. How many are

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21:21:22 1 certified?  
21:21:22 2 A. Well, certified is not the proper term. We have  
21:21:24 3 a certificate of need for 72.  
21:21:28 4 Q. Certificate of need. Who gives you the  
21:21:30 5 certificate of need, who certifies that?  
21:21:32 6 A. Again, a Certificate of Need is issued by the New  
21:21:36 7 Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services.  
21:21:38 8 Q. Do they certify that? Is that why it is called  
21:21:38 9 --  
21:21:42 10 A. No. That's why I'm trying to correct you.  
21:21:44 11 It is called a certificate of need. That's a  
21:21:44 12 terminology.  
21:21:46 13 Q. 72 beds. You have a certificate of need for  
21:21:46 14 72 beds.  
21:21:46 15 A. That's correct.  
21:21:54 16 Q. How many do you want to build?  
21:21:54 17 A. 144.  
21:21:56 18 Q. Why the discrepancy and why would you ask the  
21:22:00 19 zoning board to approve for 144, when the State has only  
21:22:04 20 given you a certificate of need for half of that?  
21:22:08 21 A. The State of New Jersey and the Department of  
21:22:12 22 Health identify the need for, I think I testified at the  
21:22:14 23 last month's meeting for almost 900 LTACH beds throughout  
21:22:20 24 the State. In our certificate of need as it is today,  
21:22:22 25 there are 72 beds. I mentioned earlier that after

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21:22:26 1 approval, we will obtain more beds from an assignment  
21:22:28 2 from various hospitals to increase that amount to 144.

21:22:32 3 Q. Were any of the beds that you have now, assigned  
21:22:34 4 from other hospitals?

21:22:36 5 A. Yes. I think I mentioned last month that  
21:22:38 6 there were. They are assigned by Hackensack University  
21:22:42 7 Medical Center and what was known at the time as PBI  
21:22:48 8 Regional Medical Center in Passaic.

21:22:50 9 Q. I want to ask you, you're also under oath as  
21:22:52 10 I am, what kind of a relationship do you have with them  
21:22:54 11 that they would give you those beds?

21:22:58 12 A. I think I testified earlier that the acute  
21:23:02 13 care hospitals in the State were assigned these beds by  
21:23:06 14 the Department of Health and those hospitals, whether it  
21:23:08 15 be Hackensack University Medical Center or any other  
21:23:10 16 hospital, have an interest in finding a place to  
21:23:14 17 discharge patients, a safe discharge where those patients  
21:23:18 18 that they no longer can serve or provide services for,  
21:23:24 19 can be safely taken care of. And that is the motivation.  
21:23:28 20 You have to ask Hackensack directly.

21:23:30 21 Q. Is there any financial enumeration to you?

21:23:32 22 A. No.

21:23:32 23 Q. Now, since you're asking to build double the  
21:23:38 24 number of beds that you've be certified for, what happens  
21:23:40 25 if you don't get that? Supposing we say go ahead build

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21:23:46 1 280 feet, the building or 240 --

21:23:50 2 A. It is actually 280 feet.

21:23:56 3 Q. Or is it too curtailed to remember?

21:23:56 4 A. Do you want me to answer?

21:23:58 5 Q. Sure, how high?

21:23:58 6 A. 280 feet, sir.

21:24:02 7 Q. So, if you're only qualified for 72 beds and  
21:24:06 8 remain only qualified for 72 beds, how do you justify a  
21:24:10 9 building that long?

21:24:12 10 A. I'm confident, there are, I believe it is 650  
21:24:20 11 LACH beds in the State of New Jersey that have not been  
21:24:22 12 spoken for, or at least not been operational. I'm quite  
21:24:28 13 confident that we could obtain the remaining 72 beds.

21:24:32 14 Q. Do you know that you can?

21:24:34 15 A. I just stated I'm very confident.

21:24:36 16 Q. That wasn't what I asked. Do you know that  
21:24:38 17 you can?

21:24:38 18 A. I'm not trying to be argumentative. I'm  
21:24:40 19 trying to be responsive, Doctor. I believe very

21:24:44 20 strongly we can retain the remainder of beds to fill a  
21:24:50 21 compliment of 144 LTACH beds that we propose for this  
21:24:52 22 project.  
21:24:52 23 Q. You also testified the State has 150 beds.  
21:25:00 24 A. There are 650 LTACH beds that have been  
21:25:02 25 identified by the State of New Jersey that are not

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21:25:08 1 implemented or not operational at this time.  
21:25:10 2 Q. How many has the State said that it needs,  
21:25:14 3 900 statewide, is that correct?  
21:25:14 4 A. That's correct.  
21:25:16 5 Q. How many are there in Bergen County now?  
21:25:16 6 A. They're 62 beds operational in Bergen County.  
21:25:22 7 Q. And any others that are permitted, other  
21:25:26 8 hospitals. 62 that are built, and you're going to build  
21:25:30 9 72. How many do you think the State wants in Bergen  
21:25:34 10 County if there are 900 in the State? Have you spoken to  
21:25:36 11 them or have any knowledge what they want for Bergen  
21:25:36 12 County?  
21:25:38 13 A. Yes, I do.  
21:25:38 14 Q. What do they want?  
21:25:40 15 A. The State identified a bed need for acute care  
21:25:46 16 hospitals. I mentioned last month there are  
21:25:48 17 approximately 85 acute care hospitals in the State.  
21:25:50 18 Q. Right.  
21:25:52 19 A. What the State identified for Bergen and  
21:25:54 20 Passaic County were 150 to 152 LTACH beds.  
21:26:02 21 Q. For both Counties.  
21:26:02 22 A. The way they established the need, and you're  
21:26:04 23 more than welcome to look at the regulations, the beds  
21:26:10 24 could be used within an hours driving distance from any  
21:26:12 25 of the acute care hospitals from which those beds are

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21:26:16 1 allocated. So, for instance, I can tell you today that  
21:26:20 2 there are 900 LTACH beds that are allocated, that the  
21:26:24 3 department of health identified the need for something  
21:26:28 4 like 625 of those beds well within one hours driving  
21:26:38 5 distance --

21:26:38 6 Q. My question is, did you just say there are 150 to  
21:26:48 7 152 that they would like to have in Bergen and Passaic  
21:26:50 8 County, is that correct?

21:26:50 9 A. What I said, is sir, is that the State  
21:26:54 10 identified based on hospitals in Bergen, Passaic County,  
21:26:58 11 a need of 152 LTACH beds for those hospitals.

21:27:04 12 Q. If you built 72 and there are 69 in Rochelle  
21:27:06 13 Park?

21:27:06 14 A. There's 62, sir.

21:27:08 15 Q. 62. Okay. How many are left to come up with 142?

21:27:14 16 A. I can do the math for you very simply. It is 144  
21:27:18 17 minus 72. 72 additional beds we're looking for.

21:27:24 18 Q. Uh huh. How interesting. What happens if someone  
21:27:28 19 else is given permission to build those beds? This is my  
21:27:32 20 question, what's going to happen to your project? Is  
21:27:36 21 there a good chance that you will not be permitted to, by  
21:27:40 22 the State, to build those beds?

21:27:40 23 A. As long as we have a certificate of need, the  
21:27:42 24 answer is no.

21:27:44 25 Q. You need that certificate of need?

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21:27:46 1 A. Yes.

21:27:46 2 Q. Let me ask you another question. You  
21:27:48 3 mentioned about how many dialysis units you're going to  
21:27:52 4 have.

21:27:52 5 A. We're proposing 84 dialysis seats or stations.

21:27:56 6 Q. Is there a certificate of need or has the State  
21:27:58 7 identified the need for additional dialysis units?

21:28:04 8 A. I think I gave extensive testimony last time  
21:28:06 9 about the need for dialysis.

21:28:08 10 Q. That wasn't my question. Has the State identified  
21:28:12 11 the need, not you, has the State?

21:28:14 12 A. If you will let me answer that fully.

21:28:16 13 Q. Sure.

21:28:16 14 A. The State does not have a certificate of need  
21:28:18 15 requirement for dialysis in the State of New Jersey.  
21:28:24 16 But there is a well known, in the health care community,  
21:28:26 17 a well known fact that there is a great need because the  
21:28:32 18 incidence of dialysis is increasing, not only in  
21:28:34 19 Hackensack proper, but the country in general.

21:28:38 20 Q. I remember you said that. So there is no  
21:28:42 21 specific articulated need from the State for these  
21:28:44 22 dialysis units, is that fair to say?  
21:28:48 23 A. Not that I'm aware, but there may well be.  
21:28:52 24 DR. HEANEY: All right. I have no  
21:28:52 25 further questions. Thank you very much.

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21:28:54 1 MR.MALAGIERE: Thank you.  
21:28:54 2 LENNY NIX: Lenny Nix, 83 Elm Street,  
21:28:54 3 sworn. QUESTIONS BY MR.NIX:  
21:29:22 4 Q. How come the address is 320 Summit Avenue  
21:29:26 5 and the building really is on Prospect Avenue?  
21:29:30 6 MR. MALAGIERE: Sir, can you respond?  
21:29:32 7 THE WITNESS: I can answer that. We  
21:29:32 8 submitted an application which listed an address for  
21:29:36 9 this proposed facility of 329 Prospect Avenue, and it is  
21:29:40 10 our intention that the address, the postal address and  
21:29:44 11 the address it is known to and the main street address  
21:29:46 12 be on Prospect Avenue. For whatever reason the board or  
21:29:52 13 whomever, assigned the address of 320 Summit Avenue.  
21:29:56 14 Q. I find this application very political and I  
21:30:00 15 really think it helps the incumbents to get a few votes.  
21:30:04 16 I don't know why they had a special meeting for this  
21:30:08 17 application, no question about this that this came out  
21:30:12 18 right before the election and to keep everybody happy,  
21:30:14 19 even if the information is false. Summit Avenue is a  
21:30:18 20 park, and it probably has the nicest pieces of  
21:30:22 21 landscaping on Summit Avenue and I've been in the town  
21:30:28 22 for 64 years and all of the people that talk about how  
21:30:30 23 beautiful it was, it isn't half as beautiful what it  
21:30:32 24 used to be. And that's all you people in the high  
21:30:38 25 rises. There were some big mansions on Summit, probably

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21:30:40 1 the biggest houses in Bergen County at the time, and  
21:30:44 2 everybody was up in arms about you people in the high  
21:30:48 3 rise. And I'm still up in arms with the people in the  
21:30:52 4 high rise because I don't think they come out and  
21:30:56 5 support the City unless their own private needs are met.  
21:30:58 6 I go to all of the meetings and I haven't seen any of  
21:31:02 7 your faces at any of the meetings. Council meetings,  
21:31:04 8 zoning board meetings or anything. If you're really  
21:31:08 9 concerned, I don't know why you don't come to the next  
21:31:10 10 council meeting, I think a lot of people are full of a  
21:31:14 11 lot of hot air in this room tonight, even with the air

21:31:18 12 conditioning going on.  
21:31:20 13 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Including you.  
21:31:20 14 AUDIENCE MEMBER: What's your question?  
21:31:20 15 MR. MALAGIERE: Hold on. Mr. Nix is  
21:31:28 16 recognized, please respect that. Go ahead Mr. Nix.  
21:31:34 17 MR. NIX: Thank you and you're rude too.  
21:31:34 18 My mother has been to this Prospect Heights, we've taken  
21:31:42 19 care of my mother's friend, she's been here twice, we  
21:31:46 20 didn't know if she would make it. She was in there and  
21:31:50 21 came out. I've been there a couple of times. It takes a  
21:31:56 22 lot out of a person and I give this gentleman credit for  
21:32:00 23 doing this type of business. And a lot of the people in  
21:32:02 24 the audience may want to volunteer and help the elderly  
21:32:06 25 sick people, instead of complaining.

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21:32:06 1 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Is there a question?  
21:32:08 2 MR. MALAGIERE: Mr. Nix, please.  
21:32:12 3 MR. NIX: I don't like rude people,  
21:32:14 4 that's what they are, very rude people. I got to -- -  
21:32:14 5 THE CHAIRMAN: Len, ask your question.  
21:32:32 6 MR. NIX: I'm actually ashamed the way  
21:32:32 7 this came out and quite obvious it's political with the  
21:32:36 8 address on Summit Avenue. I've talked to people in the  
21:32:42 9 houses and they will offer up for sale to this  
21:32:46 10 corporation so all you people with your misinformation,  
21:32:48 11 a lot of people on Summit Avenue will sell their houses  
21:32:48 12 in a snap, tomorrow, for the right number. A lot is  
21:32:58 13 going on. High rise people's heads are in the clouds  
21:33:00 14 and really don't know what what's going on. The lady  
21:33:02 15 from Fort Lee, she's so great about Hackensack, tell her  
21:33:06 16 to move to Hackensack. And I worked on that project. I  
21:33:08 17 worked on all of the high rises. I built all of the  
21:33:10 18 high rises, I'm in construction. Not to many people are  
21:33:14 19 going to tell me about Hackensack. The ones that are  
21:33:20 20 the ones in the high rise, I'm terribly upset with the  
21:33:22 21 way meetings are run in Hackensack. I don't know if I  
21:33:26 22 could say corrupt, but an unethical way they go about  
21:33:30 23 certain projects to get approved. And certain projects  
21:33:34 24 don't get approved for parking and a little bit of  
21:33:46 25 variances that this project needs, far outweigh what



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21:33:52 1 this project will do, this company is involved in saving  
21:33:54 2 people's lives.  
21:33:56 3 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you, Mr. Nix.  
21:34:00 4 MR. NIX: I'm very ashamed what's going  
21:34:00 5 on.  
21:34:00 6 CARMELLA MARRERO: Carmella Marrero, 1560  
21:34:28 7 Anderson Avenue, Fort Lee, sworn. I'm talking about the  
21:34:28 8 same addresses 316, 326, 344 and 116 Overlook Avenue.  
21:34:34 9 MR. MALAGIERE: What's your interest in  
21:34:34 10 the property?  
21:34:36 11 QUESTIONS BY Ms. MARRERO: I'm part owner of these  
21:34:38 12 properties. Unlike my Sister, I actual do work in  
21:35:02 13 Hackensack all my live, and basically on Prospect  
21:35:06 14 Avenue. As my sister stated, my father built most of  
21:35:10 15 the buildings on Prospect Avenue. I don't have a problem  
21:35:12 16 with building a building and making money. I'm all  
21:35:16 17 about that. I believe everybody should build and make  
21:35:20 18 money. I'd like to answer that gentleman, who was so  
21:35:24 19 rude to everyone (indicating).  
21:35:24 20 MR. NIX: I'm right here.  
21:35:30 21 MR. MALAGIERE: You can make comments and  
21:35:30 22 speak to this individual, but we're not going to have a  
21:35:36 23 grudge match in front of this board.  
21:35:36 24 MS. MARRERO: Prospect Avenue was a  
21:35:38 25 beautiful street with beautiful mansions. The reason

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21:35:42 1 they are high rise now there because Prospect Avenue is  
21:35:46 2 zoned for high rise.  
21:35:50 3 MR.NIX: Rezoned. Residential buildings  
21:35:50 4 and Summit Avenue is not.  
21:35:54 5 MR. MALAGIERE: No, you can't speak,  
21:35:56 6 you're not recognized. Pardon me, ma'am.  
21:35:56 7 You can't speak, you're not recognized,  
21:35:58 8 you already spoke. You can't speak. Sorry, please  
21:36:04 9 proceed. I ask everyone else to cooperate. It is  
21:36:06 10 getting late and we're trying to get through this.  
21:36:10 11 MS. MARRERO: And Summit Avenue is not.  
21:36:12 12 As far as the traffic, there is so much traffic on  
21:36:18 13 Prospect Avenue. It is unbelievable. This past  
21:36:22 14 September, October, on the corner of Prospect and Essex  
21:36:28 15 they widened the road, to get to between Beech Street to  
21:36:32 16 Prospect usually it takes me about ten minutes, which is  
21:36:36 17 one block long. I do work at 326, 316 Prospect Avenue  
21:36:42 18 and I know that at times I am re-routed because of  
21:36:52 19 ambulances, because of fire trucks, just about anything

21:36:56 20 you could imagine. As far as the street, I do think  
21:36:58 21 that some day along the lines, Hackensack Hospital is  
21:37:04 22 just going to take up the whole block. So I believe  
21:37:06 23 that the street has enough ambulances along with the  
21:37:12 24 nursing home on the side of our building, it's small  
21:37:18 25 enough. I guess it caused some traffic, I just wanted

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21:37:22 1 you to know I actually go to work at 11 o'clock in the  
21:37:26 2 morning.  
21:37:28 3 A. Everybody should be so lucky.  
21:37:30 4 Q. And I leave at 3:30 and at 11 o'clock, I'm  
21:37:34 5 in traffic and at 3:30, I'm in traffic.  
21:37:36 6 A. Maybe you should go earlier.  
21:37:42 7 Q. The other question is, like my sister, I, to, am a  
21:37:46 8 licensed real estate agent. And I just want you to know  
21:37:50 9 the property values on Prospect Avenue will not go up  
21:37:54 10 because you're building a 24-story nursing home.  
21:37:58 11 Actually they will probably go down. And in this market  
21:38:02 12 where we have declining prices, and I hate to tell you it  
21:38:06 13 is going to remain this way for a very long time, not  
21:38:10 14 just in condominiums or in homes, your building will not  
21:38:16 15 help this situation. This is not New York City yet.  
21:38:22 16 When Hackensack becomes New York City, I accept a 24  
21:38:28 17 story nursing home next to residential. But, since all  
21:38:34 18 of Hackensack -- and trust me, I've been in the trailers  
21:38:38 19 since I was thirteen years old with my father, all of  
21:38:42 20 Hackensack, there's so many areas of Hackensack that  
21:38:48 21 need to be beautified. We have Prospect Avenue and  
21:38:52 22 Summit already beautified. I just don't understand why  
21:38:58 23 you cannot go in a different location. Hackensack  
21:39:02 24 Hospital will still filter clientele to you. You just  
21:39:08 25 don't need to be there. It is just too much traffic and

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21:39:12 1 I just don't know where they are going to widen the  
21:39:16 2 street. They did it on the corner of Prospect and Essex,  
21:39:22 3 but I just don't know what would happen on Prospect and  
21:39:26 4 Passaic or Central. At 11 o'clock it should be going  
21:39:38 5 zoop, zoop. It doesn't happen that way and my family  
21:39:40 6 always wants to know why I'm late for work.  
21:39:40 7 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you.  
21:39:40 8 KAREN HULL: Karen Hull, 245 Prospect,  
21:39:40 9 3-B, sworn QUESTIONS BY MS. HULL:  
21:40:24 10 Q. Unlike Ms. Marrero, I have to go in earlier,  
21:40:24 11 and I do have to take the bus. The street is dangerous

21:40:32 12 for the people who take the bus. People are running  
21:40:32 13 across the street to take the bus, and people are walking  
21:40:36 14 their dogs. People are there with their baby carriages.  
21:40:40 15 So it's kind of dangerous already. What's dangerous for  
21:40:46 16 me is when I try to exit my building. I'm very careful.  
21:40:48 17 My car goes from zero to 60 in five seconds. And I still  
21:40:52 18 have pretty good reflexes because I'm relatively young,  
21:40:56 19 so I tried to exit my driveway one day, and I tried to go  
21:41:02 20 to the dentist, it is an impossible feat. I don't know  
21:41:06 21 how some of the other people are able to do it. I'm sure  
21:41:08 22 it takes them a long time to get out of the driveway.  
21:41:12 23 And as matter of fact, somebody hit me and  
21:41:16 24 almost killed me coming out of my own driveway. So  
21:41:20 25 safety is a factor for me, not because I can't get out of

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21:41:22 1 my driveway to go to the dentist, but also when I go to  
21:41:28 2 take the bus. I don't want to be killed as I'm trying to  
21:41:30 3 get to work. With all kinds of activity that street is  
21:41:36 4 going to have, if we build a 24-story acute center, with  
21:41:40 5 all of the cars and ambulances, are you worried about me?  
21:41:44 6 A. As I've stated earlier, and I believe our  
21:41:48 7 traffic expert will testify to that, we do not believe  
21:41:54 8 that the installation of this facility on Prospect Avenue  
21:41:58 9 will significantly impact on the existing traffic. There  
21:42:04 10 may be a lot of traffic and I just happened to read an  
21:42:06 11 annotate, I read on the internet, a town in Germany that  
21:42:10 12 decided to ban cars completely. It became a car-free  
21:42:14 13 town. They, the citizens, of that town in Germany made a  
21:42:18 14 decision to eliminate all cars. People that own cars  
21:42:22 15 have to park on the outside. The citizens of Hackensack,  
21:42:26 16 they can exercise their right to do something like that.  
21:42:28 17 I thought it was quite an unusual story that I read.  
21:42:34 18 MR. MALAGIERE: Do you have another  
21:42:36 19 question, Ma'am?  
21:42:36 20 MS. HULL: Yes, I do. I have a little bit  
21:42:38 21 longer to live, so I don't suspect that I'll sell my  
21:42:42 22 apartment right now or within the future. So after you  
21:42:44 23 build your building on my block, will I be able to sell  
21:42:48 24 my apartment? I just wonder about my property values.  
21:42:52 25 A. To address that, I believe that after our

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21:42:56 1 facility is up and running, the neighborhood and the  
21:43:02 2 community will be enhanced. It will not be a detriment  
21:43:06 3 in the community. I heard mention by Ms. Marrero and Ms.  
21:43:08 4 Luppino and others about the declining prices. It's a  
21:43:14 5 phenomena. If any one read a paper in the last 18  
21:43:20 6 months, across this country and in Hackensack, as  
21:43:22 7 anywhere else, this facility will be a benefit to the  
21:43:28 8 community and not a detriment.

21:43:28 9 Q. If it is not -- or actually, if it is a benefit,  
21:43:32 10 wonderful. If it is not, will you make up the difference  
21:43:38 11 if you're around?

21:43:40 12 A. Are you looking for a response to that?

21:43:42 13 Q. Yes. I'd like some guarantee too.

21:43:46 14 A. Sorry, we don't give guarantees.

21:43:48 15 Q. Okay. And the final thing I have to say, my  
21:43:50 16 dad actually stayed at Prospect Heights. He had open  
21:43:56 17 heart surgery and he went there. Now, he could have  
21:43:58 18 stayed at Kessler or one of the other fine facilities in  
21:44:02 19 our area, and I was selfish, my mom stayed with me and  
21:44:08 20 she could walk across the street and visit him. But the  
21:44:14 21 fact is, if he stayed at Kessler, I could have driven  
21:44:16 22 her down there, we could have walked down there, she  
21:44:18 23 could have taken a bus, no big deal. The telling thing  
21:44:22 24 was my dad one day tried to break out, so is it a  
21:44:28 25 wonderful facility that you have?

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21:44:30 1 A. I don't know your father, I'm sorry to say, and I  
21:44:32 2 hope he's doing well. Different people have different  
21:44:36 3 experiences or different anxieties. I'm really not here  
21:44:40 4 to address your father's personal or family's personal  
21:44:40 5 issues.

21:44:46 6 Q. It's telling you, though --

21:44:46 7 A. I don't think it is. Like I said --

21:44:46 8 MR. MALAGIERE: There is a lot of  
21:44:54 9 leeway, Ma'am, but it really has to stay within --

21:44:58 10 Q. I have a good question, a real good  
21:44:58 11 question. Somebody told me this week that the fourth  
21:45:00 12 floor of your existing facility is empty. Is there a  
21:45:08 13 reason for that?

21:45:08 14 A. Right now it is closed because of low  
21:45:08 15 census.

21:45:08 16 Q. A low --

21:45:14 17 A. Census. That's terminology.

21:45:16 18 Q. Does that mean no one is there?

21:45:18 19 A. Just as you said, the floor is closed today.

21:45:20 20 Q. What does that mean, why is it closed?  
21:45:22 21 MR. MALAGIERE: I think he answered the  
21:45:24 22 question.  
21:45:24 23 Q. No one is there, okay. Great. Thank you very  
21:45:24 24 much.  
21:45:24 25 MR. MALAGIERE: Thank you.

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21:45:24 1 AUDIENCE MEMBERS: SOUNDS.  
21:45:36 2 MR. MALAGIERE: Please, if you're going  
21:45:38 3 to leave, please leave quietly. We're are still  
21:45:38 4 proceeding.  
21:45:38 5 BILL NOONAN: Bill Noonan, 160 Overlook  
21:45:38 6 Avenue, 21 E, sworn. QUESTIONS BY MR. NOONAN: Thank you  
21:46:04 7 for listening to all of our statements. I do have a  
21:46:08 8 brief statement. The City in its foresight rezoned and  
21:46:12 9 zoned that area that could accommodate this facility.  
21:46:18 10 It's been stated before that there are sites available  
21:46:20 11 that could be for sale to accommodate this facility.  
21:46:26 12 I'm concerned if the integrity of Summit Avenue is  
21:46:32 13 breached with a 24-story building, and a five story  
21:46:34 14 underground parking garage. Once that integrity is  
21:46:38 15 breached, that will be the beginning of other situations  
21:46:42 16 that will be presented, to be very similar to this. And  
21:46:44 17 I just would ask that this be on the record and it be  
21:46:48 18 considered if this is breached, and this was allowed,  
21:46:52 19 this would be the first time that anything like this was  
21:46:56 20 allowed on Summit Avenue. And there is a concern, and I  
21:46:58 21 thank you.  
21:46:58 22 PIER GAILLRD Pier Gaillnrd, 260  
21:46:58 23 Standish Avenue, sworn.QUESTIONS BY MR. GAILLRD: As  
21:47:40 24 the Counsel stated, the name of this property is Bergen  
21:47:46 25 -- I have to find it, Bergen Passaic Long Term Acute

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21:47:52 1 Care Hospital. Since you stated that you only want to  
21:47:56 2 come to Hackensack, have you ever looked in Passaic or  
21:47:56 3 other towns?  
21:48:02 4 A. I think I addressed that earlier, sir, that  
21:48:04 5 we looked at other sites and we came upon this site and  
21:48:08 6 I believe this is ideally suited for this facility.  
21:48:10 7 Q. What made you think this could be the only  
21:48:20 8 property and not be in Passaic?  
21:48:20 9 A. I didn't say it was the only potential site. I  
21:48:24 10 said this is ideal in our estimation, an ideal location  
21:48:28 11 for this facility.

21:48:28 12 Q. Do you feel that Hackensack has enough tax  
21:48:32 13 free properties in Hackensack?  
21:48:36 14 A. Could you repeat that? I couldn't hear.  
21:48:38 15 Q. Do you feel, as a hospital, it will probably  
21:48:40 16 go under tax free status, we have enough tax free status  
21:48:50 17 exempt properties.  
21:48:50 18 A. I've stated several times, we're a for profit  
21:48:54 19 entity and unless the City is willing to grant us a  
21:48:56 20 waiver of real estate taxes, we would be paying real  
21:48:58 21 estate taxes. It would not be tax exempt, but we will  
21:49:02 22 welcome that if the board and County council welcomes  
21:49:02 23 it.  
21:49:06 24 Q. We, the people, will not allow that to  
21:49:08 25 happen. We have enough monkeys on our back. Something of

21:49:08 1 this magnitude will destroy the topography of the  
21:49:36 2 neighborhood and will also be a (inaudible) to arrive at  
21:49:50 3 the hospital. Also that building of that magnitude is in  
21:49:52 4 a traffic pattern of Teterboro, which is pattern 24,  
21:50:02 5 the hospital itself is too large, so we don't need  
21:50:04 6 another medical facility here. What is Hackensack going  
21:50:08 7 to outsource their cancer patients to you?

21:50:12 8 MR. MALAGIERE: Is that a question, sir.

21:50:12 9 MR. GAILLNRD: Yes.

21:50:14 10 MR. MALAGIERE: Please respond.

21:50:16 11 THE WITNESS: Our in intention is to  
21:50:16 12 provide services which is distinct and different than  
21:50:20 13 those provided at Hackensack Medical Center. As the  
21:50:24 14 audience and the Board knows, the hospital, the  
21:50:26 15 Hackensack University Medical Center, is in the process  
21:50:32 16 of constructing a new oncology center, a fairly  
21:50:34 17 significant institution, by no means do we provide the  
21:50:34 18 services that they provide there.

21:50:34 19 Q. You also will be getting patients from  
21:50:42 20 Westwood, Passaic Valley as well, since it is in Bergen  
21:50:46 21 County. And Passaic County, what will they be giving to  
21:50:50 22 Hackensack since Passaic County is not giving us  
21:50:54 23 nothing. It's not lowering our taxes or nothing. You're  
21:50:56 24 bringing more people into Hackensack. We have enough  
21:51:00 25 people in this town and the traffic.

21:51:04 1 A. What I can say to respond to that, our  
21:51:08 2 proposed facility provides what's known in, I guess, the  
21:51:12 3 health care planing circle, as a regional service  
21:51:18 4 provider to both the immediate community and surrounding  
21:51:18 5 --  
21:51:20 6 Q. That's what I said, Passaic County. That's  
21:51:22 7 why I said it should be put in Passaic County and not  
21:51:24 8 here.  
21:51:26 9 MR. MALAGIERE: Do you have any further  
21:51:26 10 questions?  
21:51:28 11 Q. Yes. You stated that your vehicles will be a GMC.  
21:51:28 12 A. Not General motors.  
21:51:28 13 Q. A CNG.  
21:51:40 14 A. I said we're exploring the possibility of  
21:51:42 15 utilizing transport vehicles powered by compressed  
21:51:42 16 natural gas.  
21:51:46 17 Q. Where are you going to put the tank so they  
21:51:48 18 can refuel them?  
21:51:52 19 A. We haven't gotten anywhere to look at that.  
21:51:56 20 It can be on-site or off site.  
21:51:56 21 Q. If it's on-site, I have 20 years of experience of  
21:52:00 22 that type of vehicle and it is no good, with my  
21:52:08 23 x-company, Con-Ed. I'm retired of 47 years of service.  
21:52:12 24 I had quite enough of experience with compressed natural  
21:52:20 25 gas. The vehicles are no good.

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21:52:22 1 A. Thank you.  
21:52:22 2 Q. When you have excess ambulances waiting for their  
21:52:26 3 patients to come down, where are they going to park?  
21:52:30 4 Q. Most of the traffic, not most, all of the traffic,  
21:52:34 5 ambulances coming and going, letting patients off, will  
21:52:38 6 park or wait at the top level of the garage underground.  
21:52:48 7 Q. You said you're going to have 400 parking spaces,  
21:52:48 8 420?  
21:52:52 9 A. 405 parking spaces.  
21:52:52 10 Q. 405. How many will be assigned to doctors?  
21:52:58 11 A. I don't believe any will be assigned  
21:53:00 12 specifically to a doctor.  
21:53:02 13 Q. Because the reason I'm asking that question  
21:53:02 14 --  
21:53:06 15 MR. MALAGIERE: Excuse me, sir, the  
21:53:08 16 Chairman indicated the meeting will be adjourned at ten  
21:53:12 17 o'clock. We are going to continue, sir, we want to see  
21:53:12 18 who else here wishes to be heard.  
21:53:16 19 Mr. Chairman, what I'm going to recommend
